WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020 the Illinois Supreme Court issued an Order in M.R. 30370 concerning the ongoing threat of COVID-19 in response to the State of Emergency declared by the Governor of the State of Illinois and the Declaration of a National Emergency by the President of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Order issued by the Illinois Supreme Court authorizes the Illinois courts to establish and periodically update temporary procedures to minimize the impact of COVID-19 on the court system; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Judge of the Twenty-Third Judicial Circuit previously issued General Order 20-03 activating the Emergency Preparedness Plan for the court in Kendall County which limits daily court proceedings to those Category 1 and 2 Essential Court Functions as set forth in the General Order;

## IT IS ORDERED:

1. That with respect to any warrants issued in relation to misdemeanor offenses, or any new misdemeanor offenses for which bond would typically be set by the court, *except* the offenses of domestic battery, violation of an order of protection, or battery, law enforcement

officers may satisfy the obligation of any warrant by releasing the individual on a recognizance bond and assigning a court date after April 20, 2020.

- 2. That this shall also apply to any outstanding body writs for failure to pay child support.
- This temporary order shall remain in effect during the time that the Emergency Preparedness
  Plan for the Kendall County Courts remains in effect.
