# Monday, September 12, 2016 Meeting Minutes

<u>Call to Order and Pledge Allegiance</u> - Chair Matthew Prochaska called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance at 5:30p.m.

Roll Call: Members Prochaska, Gilmour and Davidson were present. With three members present voting aye, a quorum was determined to conduct business.

Committee Members Absent: Scott Gryder

Others Present: Undersheriff Harold Martin, Commander Mike Peters, EMA Director Joe Gillespie, Facilities Director Jim Smiley, County Administrator Jeff Wilkins

<u>Approval of the Agenda</u> – Member Gilmour made a motion to approve the agenda, second by Member Davidson. <u>With three members present in agreement, the motion carried.</u>

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – Member Gilmour made a motion to approve the August 8, 2016 meeting minutes, second by Member Davidson. <u>With three members present in agreement, the motion carried</u>.

Member Purcell arrived at 5:38p.m

Public Comment - None

KenCom Report - Written report provided.

Member Gilmour reported that KenCom and the Oswego Police received the Rush Copley Cardiac Run of the Year Award, which reviews all 911 centers and how quickly the 911 dispatchers, the police and fire districts. There is a quarterly award and a yearly award.

Discussion on the increase in the number of calls to KenCom, if there is an increase in the number of non-emergency calls (811, 611 and other types of calls) to KenCom that have resulted in an eight percent increase for the last two months. Member Purcell asked why the calls have increased in the last two months. Member Gilmour was told that it could be weather, more accidents, youth that are out of school, noise complaints and emergencies, and said there are any numbers of events that would cause the increase in calls. Member Gilmour will further discuss the issue with KenCom leadership and report at a future meeting.

<u>Coroner's Report</u> - Written report provided.

<u>EMA Report</u> – Director Gillespie reviewed the written reported provided. Director Gillespie said that they have submitted their grant application for this year to the State. Director Gillespie said they also updated the County Emergency Management Plan and submitted it to the State.

<u>Sheriff's Report</u> – Written report provided.

- \* RFP for Video Visitation Director Gillespie briefed the committee on the RFP for Video Visitation, explained how the system would work. Member Purcell made a motion to forward the RFP for Video Visitation to the Committee of the Whole for further discussion, second by Member Gilmour. With four members voting aye, the motion carried.
- Civil Process Hours Undersheriff Martin asked that this item be postponed to the October meeting, because he is waiting to hear from the Bar Association for Kendall County, who would utilize the Civil Process office the most. There was consensus by the committee to discuss this issue at the October meeting.
- Select 4 Hire IPMG Integrity Testing Undersheriff Martin stated that the Sheriff's office will begin utilizing this testing on the new applicants. Member Purcell asked if the State's Attorney's Office has reviewed the testing, Undersheriff Martin will send the document to the State's Attorney's Office and report at the next meeting.

<u>Executive Session</u> – Member Gilmour made a motion to enter into Executive Session for the purpose of the review of discussion of minutes lawfully closed under the Open Meetings Act, whether for purposes of approval by the body of the minutes or semi-annual review of the minutes as mandated by Section 2.06, 5ILCS120-2 (1), second by Member Prochaska. <u>With four members voting aye, the motion carried.</u>

Member Purcell left the meeting at 6:16p.m.


