APPROVAL OF AGENDA – Motion made by Member Purcell to approve the agenda with the correction of adding the word "Forwarding instead of Approval" of Claims for approval in an amount not to exceed \$2,467,985.22, and Coroner Claims in an amount not to exceed \$5,480.13, second by Member Hendrix. With six members present voting aye, the motion to approve the agenda as amended carried by a vote of 6-0.

FORWARDING OF APPROVAL OF CLAIMS - Member Gilmour made a motion to forward the claims for approval in an amount not to exceed \$2,467,985.22, and Coroner Claims in an amount not to exceed \$5,480.13, second by Member Kellogg. With six members present voting aye, the motion carried by a vote of 6-0.

COMMITTEE BUSINESS

➤ Presentation of County Office Building Security Options Study — Jacob Been from Healy Bender reviewed the results of the Kendall County Office Building Security Options Study, briefed the committee on Healy Bender's recommendations, and also reviewed the projected five-year work priority list and proposed budget costs for the completed project.

- ➤ Update on Employee Healthcare Benefit Options Mr. Koeppel reported that the Horton Group was unavailable for this meeting, and that they would provide an update at the October 18, 2018 Admin HR Committee meeting.
- ▶ Discussion of FY2019 Probation Funding Discussion of the pre-trial position salaries and benefits, the agreement by Probation/Court Services on November 24, 2014, to pay the benefits for the two Pre-Trial positions, whose salaries are paid through grant funding from the Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts, as well as Probation/Court Services history of also contributing funding toward the deficit short-fall between the state funding of these salaries and the actual amount paid by the County, and the history of the transfer of \$30,000 funds to off-set the cost of existing probation department employees since 2010, from the Probation fund to the General fund. The FY2019 transfer amount should be \$30,000 for the salary deficit, plus \$25,070 for the position benefits.
- ▶ Discussion of Health Department Levy Discussion on various options for the distribution of the Health Department Levy, the Health Department personnel health insurance benefits, the health insurance, IMRF, and Social Security contribution expected for reimbursing the County each year, other services provided to the Health Department at no additional cost, such as technology services, payroll services, building maintenance and repair, building cleaning services, utilities, furniture and equipment, and discussion on other funding the Health Department receives annually such as the 708 Mental Health Levy, Senior Citizen Levy, and grant funding from various resurces.
- ➤ FY 2019 Budget Discussion Discussion on the current preliminary budget deficit, the CPI, General Fund expenditures, Capital fund requests, the employee Health Insurance projections, the revenue numbers to date, the General Fund balance projection for FY2019, estimated revenues and expenditures for FY2018, the bond payment schedule and projected savings for the next several years, and the debt service fund.

- 3) 7.01. D.33 (H) Requirement for only one range flag, a sign, cone or Red Light, seems to be a bare minimum notification requirement while Live Firing is Occurring.
- 4) 7.01. D.33 (N) Insurance Requirement Standard is set at a "Level Standard and Customary for Outdoor Target Practice or Shooting Range. Again Very Vague Language is being used.
- 5) 7.01.D.33 (R) How Many of the Existing Gun Ranges have applied and received a Land Use Permit for Gun Range Operations from Kendall County. Has this research ever been performed to confirm designated permitting procedures were adhered to? What is actual date is being used to establish Grandfather Status? I am being told that the Land Use Zoning Rules/Regulation, the formal application for Land Use permitting and the written procedures for Land Use Applications dates back to the Late 1940's.
- 6) 10.03. B.4 (a) 1 Lead Management Standards are established by the NRA or? Why three different Lead Management Standards Criteria? Again very Vague Language and possible floating or changing standard.
- 7) 10.03. b Range Layout conforms to NRA standards. At 11-13-2018 PBZ, Federal Dept. of Energy Gun Range Standards were presented in Alternate Proposal (COW Packet 57 of 90) drafted by the Citizens off Rt. 126 and Old Ridge Road, which is conveniently not in your packet. Only the first page of that Citizen Proposal is located in the today's COW Packet. If you want to see the proposal, reference page 35 to 59 of 177 of the 11-13-2018 PBZ Packet. It is a very detailed and specific proposal with many relevant diagrams. Much of the info in this Citizen Proposal regarding Gun Range Design and Safety Standards came from the Kendall County Sheriff Dept. Staff. Yet was Ignored at Tuesday's PBZ meeting.
- 8) The Citizens attending the PBZ Meetings and have watch the drafting of 17-28 also produced a 2013 State Law. 55 ILCS 5/5-1117. This State Law was discussed at the 11-13-2018 Law, Legislative and Justice Meeting on Tuesday. Ms. Gilmour referenced this Law at the PBZ Meeting, yet this law is not being referenced in 17-28 for any new Gun Ranges.
- 9) I suggested to the Kendall County Plan Commission to regulate gun ranges and establish gun range safety requirements by type of Fire Arm and in three categories, shot gun, hand gun and long rifle. The Plan Commission Like that idea, but it was rejected by the PBZ Committee. Mr. Davidson likes A-1 Special Use. I question if we have the staffing to enforce A-1 Special Use Conditions.
- 10) 17-28 has received a Negative Recommendation from the Kendall County Plan Commission and the Zoning Board of Appeals. It came out of the PBZ Committee on Tuesday with no guidance. No Motion or Second, nor up or down vote. Before the PBZ Committee even started their Tuesday night meeting, 17-28 had already been placed on today's COW Agenda.

<u>NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED</u>, the Kendall County Board hereby amends Sections 7.01.D.32, 7.01.D.33 and 10.03B.4 of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance as provided:

- I. Recitals: The recitals set forth above are incorporated as if fully set forth herein.
- II. Amended Text: The existing language of Section 7.01.D.32 is hereby deleted and replaced with the following:

7.01.D.33 Outdoor Commercial Sporting Activities including but not limited to swimming facilities and motocross sports. Appropriate regulations for lighting, noise and hours of operation shall be included in the conditions. Outdoor commercial sporting activities are activities including but not limited to polo clubs and similar uses, to exclude: outdoor target practice, athletic fields with lights, paintball facilities, and riding stables.

- III. Deleted Text: The existing language of Section 7.01.D.33 is hereby deleted in full.
- IV. Amended Text: The existing language of Section 10.03.B.4 is hereby deleted and replaced with the following:

10.03.B.4 Outdoor Commercial Sporting Activities including but not limited to swimming facilities and motocross sports. Appropriate regulations for lighting, noise and hours of operation shall be included in the conditions. Outdoor commercial sporting activities are activities including but not limited to polo clubs and similar uses, to exclude: outdoor target practice, athletic fields with lights, paintball facilities, and riding stables.

V. Amended Text: The existing language of Section 10.03.B.4 is hereby deleted and replaced with the following:

10.03.B.4 Outdoor Target Practice or Shooting, to include all shooting on commercial property (including all property inviting the retail sale of goods and/or services) and shooting ranges accommodating more than two people shooting at the same time but otherwise not including private shooting in your own yard, with the following conditions:

a. Requires conformity with NRA standards; provide appropriate berming based on surrounding land use and type(s) of firearms to be used. Such berming shall generally be consistent with standards established in the NRA Source Book. Requires conformity with U.S. Government Range Design Criteria, as that in U.S. Department of Energy Range Design Criteria, including adherence to design standards, concern for community growth, care for Surface Danger Zones (SDZs) (which require

considerable SDZs for target shooting or allow for baffle systems with canopy shields and berms to contain projectiles), and support facilities.

- I. The filings should include:
 - A. Appropriate plans for all facilities, drafted by engineers and/or architects as appropriate,
 - B. A layout of the proposed range with a safety fan in a cross section and top view,
 - C. A safety plan describing, at a minimum, the duties and qualifications range supervisors and measures planned to be taken to ensure safety of all participants, bystanders, persons and property in the environs, and to prevent projectiles from escaping the property, reviewed by a qualified range master,
 - D. A noise plan,
 - E. An environmental impact/stewardship plan,
 - F. A narrative describing, in detail, the proposed use and nature of the range, stating, at a minimum, the type of range (i.e. public, private, not-for-profit, or government), the type(s) of firearms and targets expected to be used and the proposed days and hours of operation,
 - G. As a separate plan or included in another plan, a hazardous waste plan addressing lead management conforming to all Kendall County regulations, State of Illinois laws, and United States Environmental Protection Agency's best management practices standards and regulations, and
 - H. A water and drainage plan to be approved by the Kendall County Planning, Building, and Zoning Office.
 - I. Any changes to the above required studies and plans shall be promptly forwarded to the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department.
- II. Safety Danger Zones (SDZs) should be established to contain all projectiles and debris caused by firing ammunition as dictated by U.S. Range Design Criteria. SDZ Dimensions are dictated by the types of ammunition, types of targets, and types of firing activities allowed on the rage. A basic SDZ consists of three parts: impact area, ricochet area, and secondary danger area.
 - A. The primary danger area established for the impact of all rounds extends 5° to either side of the left and right limits of fire and downrange to the maximum range of any ammunition to be used on the range.
 - B. The ricochet area is 5° to either side of the impact area and extends downrange to the maximum range of any ammunition to be used on the range.
 - C. The secondary danger area is that area paralleling, and 100 yards outside of, the outermost limits of the ricochet area and extending downrange to the maximum range of any ammunition to be used on the range. See Table 1: Maximum Range of Small Arms Ammunition.
 - D. Boundaries of SDZs must be posted with permanent signs warning persons of the danger of the live-fire range and prohibiting trespassing.

The signs must be posted in a way that will ensure a person cannot enter the SDZ without seeing at least one legible sign.

E. Limit of fire markers, both external and internal, must be used to denote right and left limits of fire. Where cross firing is to be conducted, internal limit markers must be emplaced to denote internal right or left limits of fire from specific firing positions.

F. To change the size and shape of an SDZ, baffles shall be installed Partial and full baffle systems consist of the following components: overhead baffles, a canopy shield over firing points, bullet impact berm, and side berms, sidewalls, or side baffles. A fully baffled range must be constructed so all direct fire can be contained within the range.

G. For further illustration of surface danger zones, ricochet areas, appropriate berms, baffles, canopies, and layouts, see illustrations in Attachments.

b. Requires minimum parcel size of 5 20 acres, depending on the venue.

c. Must have a sign that lists allowed firearm types, rules of operation; hearing and vision protection required.

d. State recognized, nationally recognized or NRA certified range supervisor must be present at all times when firing is taking place.

e. A range flag must be flown, a sign prominently displayed, or a red light lit at all times that firing is taking place.

f. The outdoor target practice or shooting range allowed by this special use permit shall provide the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department proof of accident and liability insurance prior to the commencement of operations; the insurance amount shall be at a level standard and customary for an outdoor target practice or shooting range and must, at a minimum, include coverage for property damage, bodily injury or death, and personal injury protection. The insurance policy must be purchased from an A++ rated (or equivalent) insurance company. An insurance policy meeting the above requirements must be maintained during the duration of the special use permit.

g. Hours and days of operation shall be specified by the Special Use Permit as determined by the County Board. Hours and days of operation shall be specified by the Special Use Permit as determined by the County Board, not to exceed one hour after sunrise to one hour before sunset.

h. Access must be controlled by a lockable gate. Access must be controlled by a locked and gated entrance. The range proper shall be gated and fenced such in a manner so as to prohibit entrance on to the property by members of the public and shall have signs posted at one hundred foot (100') intervals warning members of the public of the danger.

i. Law enforcement, fire and emergency personnel shall have security access in addition to and as required by all applicable state and federal laws.

j. Hazardous waste plan addressing lead management required.

k. No discharge of lead shot into wetland.

l. Must be at least 1,0003,000 feet from existing dwellings and property lines of schools, daycares, places of worship and airstrips.

- m. Proposals shall include site plans with safety plans, including a layout of the range with a safety fan in cross section and top view in accordance with U.S. Department of Energy criteria for Range Design.
- n. No alcohol or other drugs are allowed on the premises. No person may be under the influence of such substances while on the range and range premises.
- o. No projectiles shall leave the boundaries of the site.
- p. All applicable Federal, State and County rules and regulations shall be adhered to.
- q. Must meet all requirements of the Kendall County Health Department.
- r. Water and drainage plans must be approved by the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Office.
- s. Signage is permitted but must meet the Sign Ordinance regulations of Section 12 of the Zoning Ordinance.
- t. Lighting shall meet the standards of Section 11.02.F.12.d of the Zoning Ordinance.
- u. Must adhere to the Performance standards of Section 10.01.F of the Zoning Ordinance (Not more than sixty percent (60% of the area of the lot may be covered by buildings or structures, including accessory buildings).
- v. The range shall abide by the following noise regulations (so as not to exceed allowable residential noise in accordance with Kendall County Illinois Ordinance No. 13-18):
 - I. Day Hours: No person shall cause or allow the emission of sound during daytime hours (7:00 A.M. to 10:00 P.M.) from any noise source to any receiving residential land which exceeds sixty (60) dBA when measured at any point within such receiving residential land; provided, however, that point of measurement shall be on the property line of the complainant.
 - II. Night Hours: No person shall cause or allow the emission of sound during nighttime hours (10:00 P.M. to 7:00 A.M.) from any noise source to any receiving residential land which exceeds fifty-five (55) dBA when measured at any point within such receiving residential land; provided, however, that point of measurement shall be on the property line of the complainant.
- w. Outdoor target practice and public or private shooting ranges operating under permit prior to the date of the adoption of this ordinance [DATE] shall be exempt from this sub-section of the Zoning Ordinance, but they shall follow the restrictions on their respective special use permits.
- x. Outdoor target practice and public or private shooting ranges established after the date of the adoption of this ordinance [DATE] must comply with the above regulations or secure applicable variances.



Firing at Fixed Ground Targets



Firing at Moving Ground Targets



Or Targets Causing Ricochet




Firing at Fixed Ground Targets



Surface Danger Zone for Partially Baffled Range (Small Arms Firing at Fixed Ground Targets)



(Small Arms Firing at Fixed Ground Targets)



Ballistic Overhead Canopy



Outdoor Rifle Range Layout



Pistol Range Layout




Figure 12 Ballistic Material




Partially Baffled Ranges



Outdoor Baffled Bullet Stop





Figure 16 Baffled Range Profile

Baffle System Geometry




Figure 18 Overhead Baffle Ballistic Designs




Figure 19 Parallel Ranges

SHOOTING INTO HIS HOUSE VICTIM STATEMENT AND POLICE REPORT To the Zoning Board of appeals of Kendall County illinois. Members,

It is a fact that in any activity, or endeavor that people participate in, invariably, accidents happen. With the participants safety in mind, this is one of the reasons we impose rules governing these activities. I would call your attention to safety rules in the workplace, driving, or even rules we set in our homes for the safety of our families. The idea of eliminating or reducing the safety rules in the few areas mentioned would create a situation where accidents happen more often. I cannot imagine that reducing the rules for driving alone, would mean less accidents, it would mean more.

That being said, I would also say that an accident with a bullet is one of the most devastating, and not just for the family where life was taken, but also for the shooter where the accident of a stray bullet originated. The loss of an innocent child doing their homework at the kitchen table is incomprehensible to anyone who has not experienced this, and it happens.

From the shooters side, I cannot imagine how it would feel to that person knowing that they took an innocent life. For the shooters family, they now have to live with the fact that one of their members is in jail, for a prescribed amount of years, due to an "accident". Or all the legal wrangling this family will incur now

with all the lawsuits that will happen.

I call this boards attention to these facts because in November of 2016 my house, my living space, was the recipient of one of these "accidents". A bullet came through my rear thermopane window, crossed my family room, then went through the opposite wall, and landed on my living room floor. Fortunately, for all of us, we were not home at the time, but that bullet had enough energy to kill. Where the bullet originated from, I do not know. I do know that there is "ungoverned" outdoor practice shooting in my immediate area. I have included a copy of the Police report that was made at the time of the shooting.

In front of this board now is a proposal to reduce the safety rules governing the use of outdoor shooting ranges. As a resident of Kendall County, and the recipient of the accident stated above, I ask that this board please not change the rules now in place designed to protect your community. A reduction or removal of these safety rules would create a more dangerous situation as opposed to a safer one. I humbly ask that this Committee follow the recommendation of the Planning Commission that voted 8 to 0 to keep the rules as they stand. This is better for your county, community, and it's residents.

Kendall County Sheriff's Office Narrative Case #2016-3558 DEPUTY T. JOHNSON 11/08/2016

On 11/08-16 at approximately 1856 hours I, DEPUTY JOHNSON #109 and DEPUTY DECAMP #76 were dispatched to 8478 Old Ridge Road, Plainfield IL 60544, as the caller called to report that when they returned home from a short vacation over the weekend they discovered a bullet hole in their glass window in their living room and then went into the wall of the living room.

Upon our arrival we met with WILLIAM ALAN SALES, DOB and his wife MARIA ISABEL SALES. DOB WILLIAM and MARIA stated that they left to go to Wisconsin to visit their son on Friday, 11/04/16 at approximately 1800 hours and were gone until they returned home this evening at approximately 1800 hours. WILLIAM stated that at first he did not notice the hole in the window, however, he started to discover pieces of glass on the carpet and near the couch. WILLIAM said that once he started locating glass he then took a look around and then discovered the hole in the upper portion of the living room window which faces to the east. WILLIAM then stated MARIA began to look around as well and then located a small hole in the wall of the living room in the drywall. I asked WILLIAM if there are neighbors of his that shoot in the backyards and he stated that none of his immediate neighbors do, however he will hear what sounded like gunshot off in the far distance to the east and also to the west.

DEPUTY DECAMP then began to take photos of the window and the wall while I attempted to make contact with the neighbor to the north of WILLIAM and MARIA, however no one was home at this time or answered the door. While taking the photos DEPUTY DECAMP found the actual projectile that had come through the walls into the other room and came to rest behind a china hutch and eventually came to rest on the floor. DEPUTY DECAMP also recovered the projectile which was later placed into cyidence. See DEPUTY DECAMP's supplement report for details on the photographs and processing of the evidence.

I then explained to WILLIAM that he might want to take a walk around his house in the morning, during the daylight, where visibility would be better to see if there was any other possible damage that was caused to his house. I explained to WILLIAM that it appears this was a random isolated incident and that there is no further evidence suggesting that his house was being targeted for any reason. To the east of WILLIAM's house is Ridge Road at the intersection of Route 126. From my past experience I have known that occasionally people traveling down Route 126 have discharged firearms while driving along the road and it appears that this may be a unaccounted for projectile that someone may have been firing from a moving

On 11/08/16 at approximately 1900 hours. I. DEPUTY DECAMP #76 responded to 8478 Old Ridge Road. Plainfield to assist DEPUTY JOHNSON #109 for report of a possible criminal damage to property where the complainant was relating that upon his return from his vacation he had noticed a broken bay window and what appeared to be a stray bullet hole in the wall inside of his residence.

Upon arrival DEPUTY JOHNSON and I met with the homeowner and victim, later identified as WILLIAM A. SALES, DOB who related that upon return from being in Wisconsin with his wife, he had noticed some small shards of broken glass on his couch and upon inspection of his living room, observed what appeared to be a baseball size hole in the top of one of his bay windows on the east side of the house and a short time later directly behind the couch on the west wall in the same path of the broken window he noticed a small hole that he believed to be a bullet hole in his drywall. Upon inspection of the exterior of the residence, we could observe a large baseball size circular hole in the top part of the 6 foot tall bay window and upon further inspection of the interior of the residence in the living room, just above the couch resting against the west wall what appeared to be a small half in wide by quarter inch tall circular nature hole. We then went to the sitting room on the other side of the living room wall where we located an exit hole directly behind a corner curio cabinet location which appeared to have burst out drywall and what appeared to be a small impact point on the back of the fiber board of the curio cabinet. WILLIAM said he could not locate the projectile but still believed it to be a bullet. Upon inspection around to the south side of the curio cabinet, between the cabinet and the wall in a three inch gap. I was able to locate a small copper in color projectile resting approximately two feet away from the leg that supported the curio cabinet in between the cabinet and the south wall.

I assisted DEPUTY JOHNSON #109 in performing evidence technician duties photographing the exterior of the residence, window, shards of glass left by the broken window, both on the exterior of the residence on the bottom of the window pane and bushes outside, as well as broken glass on the blinds from the top of the hole that was located down to the base of the windowsill on the interior of the residence. I photographed the location of the hole in the wall left by the projectile which appeared to be at head level if one was to be seated on the couch. I photographed the damage done by the exit of the projectile in the opposite room, opposite the entry hole in the living room and the location of the projectile as well. All photographs were taken with and without scale. I was then able to retrieve the small copper in color projectile, and in this deputies opinion it appeared to be a pistol caliber, possibly a 9mm or 40 caliber. Upon close inspection of the projectile, it appeared to be a full copper jacketeted ball ammo round with no evidence of a hollow point in it and it appeared it was deformed as if it had ricocheted or bounced off a hard surface, possibly prior to entering the residence window and residence of Old Ridge Road.

The projectile was secured and upon my return to the Public Safety Course. I put it into produce as recovered property and possible evacence.

I downloaded all digital images taken with my camera to a verbatim CD-R disc which was released to Records for safekeeping.


Make Kendali Gun Ranges Safe Testimony ZBA Public Hearing 08/27/2018

I am Priscilla Gruber, a resident in this county over 40 years. I am asking my county to reject the current proposal 17-28 as written. It does not promote the welfare of the citizens of this county. I believe it reduces it.

- According to published county documents the intention of the proposal was to address noise and safety issues and to tighten outdoor gun range restrictions. Last fail, references to the draft proposal at the time were made to "minimum forty (40) acres in size" and "one thousand five hundred feet (1500) feet from property lines". After much discussion between boards at the county, the Planning Building and Zoning Committee asked the "expert" they chose, a commercial gun range promoter, to largely rewrite the proposal.
- The result is the current proposal that deletes any minimum acreage requirement allowing a gun range to be on any size lot. That is even worse than the currently in force rules that require 5 acres minimum.
- The 1500 foot buffer zone is completely gone. No buffer at all is even worse than the current regulations that require " at least 1000 feet from existing dwellings and property lines of schools, daycares, places of worship and airstrips." How is a 7 day per week, many hours per day, for profit outdoor gun range desirable right next to a church or school?
- it specifically exempts Forest Preserve land from any requirements. That's a lot of land in our beautiful county. It drops the requirement for a lockable gate. Does that make sense?

It downgrades the qualifications for the range supervisor from "State recognized, nationally recognized or NRA Certified range supervisor" to a person "knowledgeable of the type of shooting being supervised". Almost any shooter qualifies under that standard .

- These proposed changes do not carry out the original intentions to address noise and safety issues, tighten restrictions or promote the welfare of the county citizens.
- The Committee defends these changes by saying repeatedly that they want to decide these things " on a case to case basis" That means no one knows what the rules will be for any piece of land at any time in the future. It all depends on who is in power at the time. Elected officials change, at least in some elections, and the same people in office can change their opinions over time or when different people present their projects to approve. This is inviting unpredictability, inconsistency and favors to be considered. That is government by men (or people) not
- Respect for the Rule of Law, including the equal application of the laws to all citizens, and over time, in other words consistency and predictability, is bedrock in our Constitution. It is what makes us different from Kingdoms and dictatorships. We need this here in Kendali County too. We ask our County Board to do the job we elected them to do, write up the regulations now so we know what they are; don't leave them to decide each time somebody asks on " a case by case basis".
- Look how many people are here concerned about this. I ask you to reject this inadequate proposal so our county can start over to truly promote the welfare of all county citizens.

Shooting Ranges (Not Including Private Shooting in Your Own Yard)

In 2017, the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Committee researched outdoor target practice and shooting range regulations of several neighboring and nearby counties. After submitting an initial proposal to the advisory boards and receiving their feedback and the feedback of other interested parties, the Planning, Building and Zoning Committee drafted the current proposal and started the adoption process in June 2018.

A redlined version of the existing regulations compared to the proposal is attached. The proposal is also attached.

ZPAC reviewed the original proposal, but did not review the amended proposal.

At their meeting on July 25, 2018, the Kendall County Regional Planning Commission unanimously recommended denial of the proposal.

The following comments on the proposal were provided at the July 25th meeting:

Ms. Wilson looked into the downstate Downstate Forest Preserve Act and could not find exemptions that pertained to the special use permit applied to the Kendall County Forest Preserve. There are permits that can be granted to outside users. Ms. Wilson also questioned where the source of the proposal originated. Mr. Asselmeier noted the Planning, Building and Zoning Committee made the final call for what was put in the proposal. Ms. Wilson questioned what reason for the minimum of five (5) acre lot size. Mr. Asselmeier noted it was set at that requirement back in 2015. The Planning, Building and Zoning Committee wanted the dimensions to be based on the setbacks, berming requirements and type of firearm. All the other setbacks would have to be met, even if the five (5) acre requirement is not obtained.

Mr. Nelson stated that the decision of the County Board on this matter is not based on law. He questioned why the language should be put in if the Kendall County Forest Preserve is exempted. If the regulations are already in the law, there is no reason to put it in the ordinance. Mr. Nelson understood looking at petitions on a case-by-case basis, but did feel that greater direction was needed.

Mr. Shaw questioned the noise requirement and if shooting can last all night. Chairman Ashton responded that it depends on a case-by-case basis and that shooting could

occur all night under the proposal. Chairman Ashton noted the Sheriff Department's range was approved years ago and the proposal does not apply to that range.

Discussion occurred regarding the Sheriff Department's range. Mr. Davidson responded that the special use allows lights. Chairman Ashton noted the special use permit did not allow lights. However, the special use permit should include lights if someone wants to put up lights. Mr. Nelson noted, if someone has a special use permit with no restrictions on hours of operation, it is reasonable for the individual to put up lights. Mr. Asselmeier noted the time for the range was 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. and that lighting shall meet the standards of the zoning order. Ms. Wilson agreed with Mr. Shaw. She stated she lives next to a shooting range and would not be okay with it going on after 10 p.m. She also advocated for a lower decimal level because noise can be disruptive and dangerous to the public.

The Kendall County Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing on this proposal on August 27, 2018. The Zoning Board of Appeals voted to recommend denial of the proposal with two (2) members voting in favor and four (4) members voting against the proposal. Mr. LeCuyer stated the proposal needs to reference the qualifications for the range masters. Mr. Fox stated the overall issues with the proposal such as safety, qualifications for range master, and the hours of operation. Mr. Cherry stated the proposal has too many grey issues for him and the proposal needs to be reworked. Chairman Mohr stated his concerns are there should be a minimum standard and modified later with variances if needed. The range master qualifications needed to be fixed and minimum should be kept in the proposal. The townships have been informed of this proposal. On September 19, 2018, Na-Au-Say Township filed a formal objection. Their objection and reasons for objecting to the proposal are attached to this memo.

Several residents submitted concerns regarding this proposal. Their concerns were discussed at the November 13, 2018, Planning, Building and Zoning Committee meeting and are attached to this memo.

Na-Au-Say Township's Reasons for Objecting
Concerns of Residents

Outdoor Target Practice or Shooting (not including private shooting In your own property or shooting ranges located on property owned by the Kendall County Forest Preserve District or the State of Illinois used for State Parks) with the following conditions:

- a. Requires conformity with NRA standards; provide appropriate berming based on surrounding land use and type(s) of firearms to be used. Such as berming shall generally be consistent with standards established in the NRA Source Book. (See requirements b, c, and d of the proposal)
- b. Requires minimum parcel size of 5 acres, depending on the venue. Must meet setbacks of the zoning district. (See requirement k of the proposal)
- c. Must have a sign that lists allowed firearm types based on the special use permit, rules of operation; hearing and vision protection required. (See requirement f of the proposal)
- d. State-recognized, nationally recognized or NRA Certified range supervisor At least one (1) designated qualified person must be present at all times when firing is taking place at forprofit outdoor target practice or shooting ranges. The qualified person shall be knowledgeable of the type of shooting being supervised, shall be approved by the owner of the range, and shall know and enforce all range rules. (See requirement g of the proposal)
- e. At least one (1) Rrange flag flown, a sign, cone, or red light lit at all times that firing is taking place. (See requirement h of the proposal)
- f. Hours and days of operation as specified in the Special Use Permit to be determined by the County Board. (Unchanged-see requirement i of the proposal)
- g. Access must be controlled by a gated entrance lockable gate. The range proper shall be gated and fenced in a manner so to prohibit entrance on the property by members of the public and shall have signs posted at one hundred foot (100') intervals warning members of the public of the danger. Berming may substitute for fencing. (See requirement j of the proposal)
- h. Hazardous waste plan addressing lead management required. (See requirement a of the proposal)
- i. No discharge of lead shot into wetland. (See requirement o of the proposal).
- j. Must be at least 1,000' from existing dwellings and property-lines of schools, daycares, places of worship and airstrips. Must meet setbacks of the zoning district. (See requirement k of the proposal
- k. No alcohol allowed. (Unchanged-see requirement I of the proposal)
- I. No projectiles shall leave the boundaries of the site. (Unchanged-see requirement ${\bf m}$ of the proposal)
- m. All applicable Federal, State and County local rules and regulations shall be adhered to. (See requirement o of the proposal)
- n. Must meet all requirements of the Kendall County Health Department. (See requirement o of the proposal)

- o. Water and drainage plans must be approved by the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Office. (See requirement a of the proposal)
- p. Signage is permitted but must meet the Sign Ordinance regulations of Section 12 of the Zoning Ordinance. (See requirement o of the proposal)
- q. Lighting shall meet the standards of Section 11.02.F.12.d of the Zoning Ordinance. (See requirement o of the proposal)
- r. Must adhere to the Performance standards of Section 10.01.F of the Zoning Ordinance (Unchanged-see requirement p of the proposal)

New regulations:

- 1. Safety area and range must be under the control of the operator of the range. (Requirement e)

ORDINANCE # 2018-

TEXT AMENDMENT TO SECTIONS 7.01.D.32, 7.01.D.33 AND 10.03.B.4 OF THE KENDALL COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE PERTAINING REGULATIONS OF OUTDOOR COMMERCIAL SPORTING ACTIVITIES AND OUTDOOR TARGET PRACTICE OR SHOOTING RANGES (NOT INCLUDING PRIVATE SHOOTING IN YOUR OWN YARD)

<u>WHEREAS</u>, 55 ILCS 5/5-12001 grants Kendall County the authority to regulate and restrict the location and use of structures and uses for the purpose of promoting the public health, safety, morals, comfort and general welfare throughout the unincorporated areas of the County; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, gun clubs were a permitted use in the A-1 Agricultural District under the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance adopted January 16, 1940; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, gun clubs were reclassified as a special use in the A-1 Agricultural District under the Kendall County Zoning Ordinances adopted in 1959 and July 9, 1974; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, outdoor shooting ranges were classified as a similar use to gun clubs per the hearing of the Kendall County Zoning Board of Appeals on September 30, 1982 and were included as a special use in the A-1 Agricultural District by Ordinance 82-11 adopted November 9, 1982; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the restrictions governing target practice or shooting (not including private shooting in your own yard) in the A-1 Agricultural District and M-3 Earth Materials Extraction, Processing and Site Reclamation District were established through Ordinance 2013-14 adopted July 16, 2013; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>. Section 13.07 of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance permits the Kendall County Board to approve text amendments and provides the procedure through which text amendments are granted; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, on or about September 11, 2017, the Kendall Count Planning, Building and Zoning Committee, hereinafter be referred to as "Petitioner", submitted a text amendment to the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance pertaining to outdoor target practice and shooting range zoning regulations; and

WHEREAS, on or about June 11, 2018, the Petitioner amended the proposed text amendment:

<u>WHEREAS</u>, following due and proper notice by publication in the Kendall County Record on August 9, 2018, the Kendall County Zoning Board of Appeals conducted a public hearing on August 27, 2018, at 7:00 p.m., in the County Office Building at 111 W. Fox Street in Yorkville, at which the Petitioner and the Petitioner's representative presented evidence, testimony, and exhibits in support of the requested text amendment and four (4) members of the public testified in favor of the request and eleven (11) members of the public testified in opposition to the request; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, based on the evidence, testimony, and exhibits, the Kendall County Zoning Board of Appeals has recommended denial of the text amendment on August 27, 2018; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, 55 ILCS 5/5-12014 (c) grants certain townships the right to file formal objections to proposed text amendments; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the Township of Na-Au-Say did file a formal objection in a manner permissible by State law; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, 55 ILCS 5/5-12014 (c) requires the approval of at least three-fourths of a County Board to approve a text amendment over the formal objection of certain townships; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Committee of the Kendall County Board has reviewed the testimony presented at the aforementioned public hearing and Recommendation of the Kendall County Zoning Board of Appeals, and has forwarded to the Kendall County Board the requested text amendment; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the Kendall County Board has considered the recommendations of the Planning, Building and Zoning Committee and the Kendall County Zoning Board of Appeals, and has determined that said petition is in conformance with the provisions and intent of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance; and

<u>NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED</u>, the Kendall County Board hereby amends Sections 7.01.D.32, 7.01.D.33 and 10.03.B.4 of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance as provided:

- I. Recitals: The recitals set forth above are incorporated as if fully set forth herein.
- II. Amended Text: The existing language of Section 7.01.D.32 is hereby deleted and replaced with the following:

"7.01.D.32 Outdoor Commercial Sporting Activities including but not limited to swimming facilities and motocross sports. Appropriate regulations for lighting noise and hours of operation shall be included in the conditions. Outdoor commercial sporting activities shall

exclude outdoor target practice (such exclusion extends to shooting ranges located on property owned by the Kendall County Forest Preserve District or the State of Illinois used for State parks), athletic fields with lights, paintball facilities and riding stables, including but not limited to polo clubs, and similar uses."

III. Amended Text: The existing language of Section 7.01.D.33 is hereby deleted and replaced with the following:

"7.01.D.33 Outdoor Target Practice or Shooting (but not including private shooting on your own property or shooting ranges located on property owned by the Kendall County Forest Preserve District or the State of Illinois used for State parks) with the following conditions:

- a. At the time of application for a special use permit, petitioners desiring to operate an outdoor target practice or shooting ranges shall submit copies of all of the studies and plans suggested in the National Rifle Association's Source Book including, but not limited to, a safety plan, a business plan, a public relations plan, a maintenance plan, a noise plan, an environmental stewardship plan, and a closure plan.
 - 1. The above referenced plans shall contain information as suggested by the National Rifle Association.
 - 2. Included in the above documents, the petitioner shall submit a detailed written narrative describing the proposed use. This narrative shall, at minimum, describe the type of range (i.e. public, private, or government), the type(s) of firearms and targets expected to be used and the proposed days and hours of operation.
 - 3. The safety plan shall describe the duties and qualifications of range supervisor(s).
 - 4. In at least one (1) of the required studies or plans, a hazardous waste plan addressing lead management shall be included. The lead management plan shall conform to either the requirement of the National Rifle Association's standards, the National Shooting Sports Foundation's standards, or the United States Environmental Protection Agency's best management practices standards.
 - 5. In addition to the above requirements, the petitioner shall submit a water and drainage plan; this plan must be approved by the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Office.
 - 6. Any changes to the above required studies and plans shall be promptly forwarded to the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department.
- b. Range layout requires conformity with National Rifle Association standards with regard to layout and dimensions. The petitioner shall submit a site capacity with a calculation and a detailed site plan showing the layout and design of the proposed shooting range, including all

required setbacks and landscaping and the existing and proposed structures, their floor areas and impervious surfaces. The scale of the site plan shall be no greater than one inch equals one hundred feet (1"=100"). A licensed engineer or land surveyor shall prepare the documents.

- c. The site plan for the proposed outdoor target practice or shooting range must show either sufficient berm height with sufficient downrange safety area or baffling that prevents projectiles from leaving the site.
 - 1. The safety area shall conform to National Rifle Association's standards for the shape and width. The safety area shall have signs posted at intervals stated in the special use permit warning of the potential danger from stray bullets.
 - 2. For the purposes of this regulation, the term "downrange safety area" shall mean the area away from the launching site towards the target. In cases of shooting ranges where targets are not stationary, appropriate baffling shall be provided.
- d. Public ranges designed for the use of handguns and rifles shall provide berms at least twenty feet (20') high and six feet (6') thick at the top for ranges three hundred feet (300') in length, made of soft earth or other material that is unlikely to cause ricochets, and containing no large rocks. For every thirty feet (30') of firing line distance over twenty feet (20'), the berm height shall increase by ten feet (10') in height as an example. Berms shall be located as follows:
 - 1. Shotgun ranges No berming required.
 - 2. Ranges for handguns and rifles
 - a. Target placement not to exceed twenty feet (20') from the backstop.
 - b. Lateral not closer than thirty feet (30') from the firing line.
 - 3. All required berms shall be constructed prior to the commencement of operations and shall be maintained for the duration of the special use permit.
 - 4. In addition to berms, appropriate baffling may be installed over the firing line creating a "no blue sky" to prevent projectiles from overshooting the berm.

- ranges. The qualified person shall be knowledgeable of the type of shooting being supervised, shall be approved by the owner of the range, and shall know and enforce all range rules.
- h. At least one (1) range flag flown, a sign, cone, or red light lit at all times that firing is taking place.
- i. Hours and days of operation shall be specified in the special use permit and determined by the County Board.
- j. Access must be controlled by a gated entrance. The range proper shall be gated and fenced in a manner so to prohibit entrance on the property by members of the public and shall have signs posted at one hundred foot (100') intervals warning members of the public of the danger. Berming may substitute for fencing.
- k. Must meet existing setbacks of the zoning district.
- No alcohol allowed.
- m. No projectiles shall leave the boundaries of the site.
- n. The outdoor target practice or shooting range allowed by this special use permit shall provide the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department proof of accident and liability insurance prior to the commencement of operations; the insurance amount shall be at a level standard and customary for an outdoor target practice or shooting range. The insurance policy must be purchased from an A+ rated insurance company. An insurance policy meeting the above requirements must be maintained during the duration of the special use permit.
- o. All applicable Federal, State and local rules and regulations shall be adhered to.
- p. Must adhere to the Performance standards of Section 10.01.F of the Zoning Ordinance (Not more than sixty percent (60%) of the area of the lot may be covered by buildings or structures, including accessory buildings).
- q. No person shall cause or allow the emission of sound from any noise source to any receiving residential land which exceeds sixty-five (65) dBA when measured at any point within such receiving residential land provided; however, that point of measurement shall be on the residential

property line of the complainant.

- r. Outdoor target practice and public or private shooting ranges in existence prior to the date of the adoption of this ordinance (November 20, 2018) shall be exempt from this sub-section of the Zoning Ordinance, but they shall follow the restrictions on their respective special use permits.
- S. Outdoor target practice and shooting ranges open to the public established after the date of the adoption of this ordinance (November 20, 2018) must comply with the above regulations or secure applicable variance(s)."
- IV. Amended Text: The existing language of Section 10.03.B.4 is hereby deleted and replaced with the following:

"10.03.B.4 Outdoor Target Practice or Shooting (not including private shooting on your own property and shooting ranges located on property owned by the Kendall County Forest Preserve District or the State of Illinois used for State parks) with the following conditions:

- a. At the time of application for a special use permit, petitioners desiring to operate an outdoor target practice or shooting ranges shall submit copies of all of the studies and plans suggested in the National Rifle Association's Source Book including, but not limited to, a safety plan, a business plan, a public relations plan, a maintenance plan, a noise plan, an environmental stewardship plan, and a closure plan.
 - 1. The above referenced plans shall contain information as suggested by the National Rifle Association.
 - 2. Included in the above documents, the petitioner shall submit a detailed written narrative describing the proposed use. This narrative shall, at minimum, describe the type of range (i.e. public, private, or government), the type(s) of firearms and targets expected to be used and the proposed days and hours of operation.
 - 3. The safety plan shall describe the duties and qualifications of range supervisor(s).
 - 4. In at least one (1) of the required studies or plans, a hazardous waste plan addressing lead management shall be included. The lead management plan shall conform to either the requirement of the National Rifle Association's standards, the National Shooting Sports Foundation's standards, or the United States Environmental Protection Agency's best management practices standards.
 - 5. In addition to the above requirements, the petitioner shall submit a water and drainage plan; this plan must be approved by the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Office.

- Any changes to the above required studies and plans shall be promptly forwarded to the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department.
- b. Range layout requires conformity with National Rifle Association standards with regard to layout and dimensions. The petitioner shall submit a site capacity with a calculation and a detailed site plan showing the layout and design of the proposed shooting range, including all required setbacks and landscaping and the existing and proposed structures, their floor areas and impervious surfaces. The scale of the site plan shall be no greater than one inch equals one hundred feet (1"=100"). A licensed engineer or land surveyor shall prepare the documents.
- c. The site plan for the proposed outdoor target practice or shooting range must show either sufficient berm height with sufficient downrange safety area or baffling that prevents projectiles from leaving the site.
 - 1. The safety area shall conform to National Rifle Association's standards for the shape and width. The safety area shall have signs posted at intervals stated in the special use permit warning of the potential danger from stray bullets.

- d. - o. All applicable Federal, State and local rules and regulations shall be adhered to.

- p. Must adhere to the Performance standards of Section 10.01.F of the Zoning Ordinance (Not more than sixty percent (60%) of the area of the lot may be covered by buildings or structures, including accessory buildings).
- q. No person shall cause or allow the emission of sound from any noise source to any receiving residential land which exceeds sixty-five (65) dBA when measured at any point within such receiving residential land provided; however, that point of measurement shall be on the residential property line of the complainant.
- r. Outdoor target practice and public or private shooting ranges in existence prior to the date of the adoption of this ordinance (November 20, 2018) shall be exempt from this sub-section of the Zoning Ordinance, but they shall follow the restrictions on their respective special use permits.
- s. Outdoor target practice and shooting ranges open to the public established after the date of the adoption of this ordinance (November 20, 2018) must comply with the above regulations or secure applicable variance(s)."
- V. Any completed application submitted prior to the date of the adoption of this ordinance shall follow the application procedures, requirements and restrictions in effect on the date that the completed application was submitted.

In 2017, the Kendall County Regional Planning Commission and Comprehensive Land Plan and Ordinance Committee started the process of considering amendments to the Future Land Use Map in Lisbon Township along Route 47. The reason for considering changes at this time was because of the widening of Route 47 to four (4) lanes in Lisbon Township.

The proposed changes were based on the following:

1. The mining area was designated because that was the location of the rock.

- 2. A commercial area should be designated on the east side of Route 47 north of the Grundy County line because everything else in the area was proposed to be industrial/office use.
- The intersection of Routes 47 and 52 were designed as commercial to provide the Village of Lisbon an opportunity to place sales tax generating business. The southeast corner of this intersection was designated mixed use business because of the grain operation at this location.
- 4. The intersection of Route 47 and Plattville Road was designed as commercial to provide the Village of Plattville an opportunity to place sale tax generating businesses.
- 5. The rest of the corridor was classified as mixed use business.
- 6. Outer roads were proposed on both sides of Route 47 to prevent the highway from becoming congested with multiple turnouts.
- 7. Because of the need for buffering the mining area, the need for outer roads, and the anticipated businesses that would locate along the corridor, the corridor was set at one half (1/2) mile wide on both sides of Route 47.

On February 28, 2018, the Kendall County Regional Planning Commission and Comprehensive Land-Plan and Ordinance Committee held a joint meeting in Plattville. Sixteen (16) members of the public attended the meeting. The overwhelming majority of the public in attendance favored maintaining the entire corridor as agricultural. A small minority favored small businesses like Casey's at Routes 47 and 52. Nobody in the audience favored commercial and industrial uses along the corridor when specifically asked. The Village of Lisbon also explained their sanitary sewer situation.

Following the meeting in Plattville, the Comprehensive Land Plan and Ordinance Committee decided to incorporate the Village of Lisbon's Future Land Use Map in the proposed map. Shortly thereafter, the State announced that it was not renewing the centerline protection of the Prairie Parkway. The consensus of the Comprehensive Land Plan and Ordinance Committee was to retain the Prairie Parkway alignment on the map for the short term as an historical reference point for planning purposes.

The Kendall County Regional Planning Commission held a public hearing on this proposal on June 27, 2018. With minimal discussion and nobody from the public expressing opposition, the Kendall County Regional Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of the proposal.

The Kendall County Zoning Board of Appeals held a meeting on this proposal on July 30, 2018.

Seven (7) members of the public expressed opposition to this proposal and nobody from the public spoke in favor of the proposal. Many of those that spoke desired to preserve farmland and prevent the expansion of mining in the area. Some of the members of the public were concerned that, if the proposal was approved, the door would be opened to non-agricultural uses along the corridor. One (1) member of the public wanted the Prairie Parkway alignment removed because showing the alignment did not serve a planning purpose in their opinion. The Kendall County Zoning Board unanimously recommended denial. Ms. Clementi agreed with Mr. Thompson and Mr. LeCuyer and believed more input from the community should be taken into account. She wished for agriculture to be preserved in the area. Mr. Cherry understood the residents' opinions on the matter, but he was still on the fence and just thought he should vote no. Mr. Thompson stated he had some problems with the proposal since he comes from an agriculture background. Also, he stated the importance of a plan. Mr. Whitfield recommended that anyone wanting to preserve their land should work with the Conservation Foundation. Mr. LeCuyer stated there should be more discussion with the residents in the area. He argued there was use and value to the land and the only way to preserve the land is placing it in a conservation trust. Chairman Mohr stated the plan was meant to be a fluid document. He reiterated that zoning is not going to be changed but does believe that certain parts of the proposal needed to be reexamined. He believed that the Prairie Parkway should be kept for on the map for historical purposes. He also argued the one half (1/2) mile corridor was excessive.

At the Zoning Board of Appeals meeting, five (5) attendees indicated they did not receive notification of the meeting by letter. Staff mailed the letters July 5th; the letters were not sent certified because Staff believes that State law does not require certified mailings for changes to the Land Resource Management Plan. Unlike a rezoning, a change to the Future Land Use Plan is not binding and has no direct legal action on what a property owner can and cannot do with their land.

The Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Committee discussed this issue at their meeting in August, September, and October 2018. The Committee recommended that the proposal be forwarded to the Committee of the Whole to allow residents to voice their concerns directly to County Board members.

Fox Street in Yorkville, at which the Petitioner presented evidence, testimony, and exhibits in support of the requested amendment and one member of the public asked questions and zero members of the public testified in favor or testified in opposition to the request; and

WHEREAS, following due and proper notice by publication in the Kendall County Record not less than fifteen days prior thereto, the Kendall County Zoning Board of Appeals met on July 30, 2018, at 7:00 p.m., in the County Office Building at 111 W. Fox Street in Yorkville, at which the Petitioner presented evidence, testimony, and exhibits in support of the requested map amendment and seven members of the public expressed opposition to the proposal; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, based on the evidence, testimony, and exhibits, the Kendall County Zoning Board of Appeals has recommended denial of the proposed amendment; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Committee of the Kendall County Board has reviewed the testimony presented at the aforementioned public hearing and meetings, and has forwarded to the Kendall County Board a recommendation of approval of the proposed amendment; and





18-13 Proposed Text Amendments Pertaining to Solar Panel Zoning Regulations

At their meeting on March 12, 2018, the Planning, Building and Zoning Committee approved initiating text amendments to the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance incorporating DeKalb County's proposed solar panel regulations into the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance.

The amendment worksheet is attached to this memo.

Mr. Holdiman previously suggested that 4.18.0.2 be removed from the proposal because the County currently does not require insurance for existing solar panels.

The Kendall County Farm Bureau was sent the proposal in March. They questioned why the bonding requirement was "may" and not "shall" (4.18.P.6).

The townships were mailed the proposal on March 22nd and were notified of the results of the July 30, 2018, Zoning Board of Appeals hearing. To date, no townships have submitted comments.

ZPAC met on the proposal on April 3rd and unanimously recommended approval of the proposal with the following amendments:

- 1. Section 4.18.D.10 should be removed because the same language is found in 4.18.Q.3.
- 2. A more detailed contour map with existing vegetation, waterways, wetland boundaries, and FEMA FIRM information in a manner described in the Boone County ordinance should be added to the proposal.
- 3. The reference to the State of Illinois Uniform Building Code found in Section 4.18,C.8 should be removed.
- 4. Greater discussion should occur regarding the desire to have solar gardens in residential zoned districts.
- 5. The word "crops" found in line 7 of 4.18.C.4 should be replaced with the word "vegetation" because crops probably will not be the only plants growing around the solar panels and crops probably will not grow around the solar panels.

The Kendall County Regional Planning Commission met on May 23, 2018, and recommended approval of the proposal with the following changes.

1. The reference to a county solar garden in the definition of "Solar Garden" should be deleted.

- 2. All references to waiving the special use permit requirements and setback requirements should be deleted.
- 3. Solar gardens and solar farms had to follow the setback requirements for the zoning district in which they are located. Accordingly, the reference to a one hundred foot (100') distance from the right-of-way or property line found in 4.18.D.2 should be deleted.
- 4. The statement that solar farms require a special use permit found in Section 4.18.D.1 should be removed.
- 5. If allowed by the State's Attorney's Office, a provision should be added to Section 4.18.F regarding repair of damaged drain tile.

The Kendall County Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing on this proposal on July 30, 2018. No members of the public testified in favor or in opposition to the proposal. The Zoning Board of Appeals unanimously recommended approval of the proposal.

The State of Illinois recently approved an Agricultural Impact Mitigation Agreement (AIMA) requirement. This proposal requires decommissioning to be completed within six (6) months of the commencement of the decommissioning plan (4.18.P.4); the AIMA allows a maximum twelve (12) month for decommissioning to occur (17.B). In addition, the proposal gives the County Board discretion whether or not to require a decommissioning bond (4.18.P.6); the AIMA allows decommissioning Financial Assurance to be phased over the first eleven (11) years (17.D).

At their meeting on September 10, 2018, the Planning, Building and Zoning Committee recommended forwarding the proposal to the Committee of the Whole with the decommissioning bond requirement changed from "may" to shall in 4.18.P.6.

The proposal in ordinance form is also attached to this memo.

Amend Section 3.02 by adding the following terms and definitions:

ACTIVE SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM. A solar energy system whose primary purpose is to harvest energy by transforming solar energy into another form of energy or transferring heat from a collector to another medium using mechanical, electrical, or chemical means.

BUILDING-INTEGRATED SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEMS. An active solar energy system that is an integral part of a principal or accessory building, rather than a separate mechanical device, replacing or substituting for an architectural or structural component of the building. Building-integrated systems include but are not limited to photovoltaic or hot water solar energy systems that are contained within roofing materials, windows, skylights, and awnings.

GRID-INTERIE SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM. A photovoltaic solar energy system that is connected to an electric circuit served by an electric utility company.

GROUND MOUNT SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM. A solar energy system mounted on a rack or pole that rests on or is attached to the ground.

OFF-GRID SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM. A photovoltaic solar energy system in which the circuits energized by the solar energy system are not electrically connected in any way to electric circuits that are served by an electric utility company.

PASSIVE SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM. A solar energy system that captures solar light or heat without transforming it to another form of energy or transferring the energy via a heat exchanger.

PHOTOVOLTAIC SYSTEM. An active solar energy system that converts solar energy directly into electricity.

ROOF MOUNT SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM. A solar energy system that is mounted on a rack that is fastened onto a building roof.

SOLAR ACCESS. Unobstructed access to direct sunlight on a lot or building through the entire year, including access across adjacent parcel air rights, for the purpose of capturing direct sunlight to operate a solar energy system.

SOLAR COLLECTOR. An assembly, structure, and the associated equipment and housing, designed for gathering, concentrating, or absorbing direct and indirect solar energy for which the primary purpose is to convert or transform solar radiant energy into thermal, mechanical, chemical or electrical energy.

SOLAR ENERGY. Radiant energy received from the sun that can be collected in the form of heat or light by a solar collector.

SOLAR ENERGY EASEMENT. An easement that limits the height or location, or both, of permissible development on the burdened land in terms of a structure or vegetation, or both, for the purpose of providing access for the benefited land to wind or sunlight passing over the burdened land.

SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM (SES). All components required to become a complete assembly or structure that will convert solar energy into electricity for use.

SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM ADDITION. A private solar energy system which is structurally attached to a building or structure on the zoning lot on which said system is located. Said system shall be considered part of the building and shall comply with all provisions of this ordinance pertaining thereto.

SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM, PRIVATE. A collection of one (1) or more solar collectors designed for use by the occupant(s) of the zoning lot on which said system is located; excess power generation is limited to net metering or similar technology with regulations set by the local power utility, community, county, and state. Private solar energy system equipment shall conform to applicable industry standards, and applicants for building permits for private solar energy systems shall submit certificates from equipment manufacturers that the equipment is manufactured in compliance with industry standards.

SOLAR FARM. A commercial facility that converts sunlight into electricity, whether by photovoltaics (PV), concentrating solar thermal devices (CST), or other conversion technology, for the primary purpose of wholesale sales of generated electricity. A solar farm is the principal land use for the parcel on which it is located.

SOLAR GARDEN. A commercial solar-electric (photovoltaic) array, of no more than 20 acres in size, that provides retail electric power (or a financial proxy for retail power) to multiple households or businesses residing in or located off-site from the location of the solar energy system. A county-solar garden may be either an accessory use, when a part of an existing or a proposed subdivision or a special use if it is a stand-alone garden. (Updated 5/24/18)

SOLAR HEAT EXCHANGER. A component of a solar energy device that is used to transfer heat from one substance to another, either liquid or gas.

SOLAR HOT AIR SYSTEM. An active solar energy system (also referred to as Solar Air Heat or Solar Furnace) that includes a solar collector to provide direct supplemental space heating by heating and re-circulating conditioned building air.

SOLAR HOT WATER SYSTEM. A system (also referred to as Solar Thermal) that includes a solar collector and a heat exchanger that heats or preheats water for building heating systems or other hot water needs, including residential domestic hot water and hot water for commercial processes.

SOLAR MOUNTING DEVICES. Racking, frames, or other devices that allow the mounting of a solar collector onto a roof surface or the ground.

SOLAR STORAGE UNIT. A component of a solar energy device that is used to store solar generated electricity or heat for later use.

Amend Section 4.18 as follows:

4.18 SOLAR PANELS

- A. Roof Mounted for On-Site Energy Consumption. Solar panels located on the roof of an existing structure shall be permitted in all districts. Roof mounted solar energy systems shall not extend beyond the exterior perimeter of the building on which the system is mounted. Roof mounted solar energy systems shall not exceed the maximum allowed height in any zoning district. Roof mounted or building integrated private solar energy systems for residential or business use shall be considered an accessory use in all zoning districts where there is a principal structure and shall meet the regulations of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance. Roof mounted solar panels used as accessory to agricultural uses and which the energy generated from the solar panels is consumed on-site shall be exempt from building permits. The use of roof mounted solar panels for on-site energy consumption shall comply will all applicable federal, state, and local laws and the rules of the local electrical utility. (Updated 5/14/18)
- B. Freestanding for On-Site Energy Consumption. Solar panels located on the ground or attached to a framework located on the ground shall be classified as accessory structures in all zoning districts provided that the system is no larger than necessary to provide one hundred twenty percent (120%) of the electrical and/or thermal requirements of the structure to which it is accessory as determined by a contractor licensed to install photovoltaic and thermal solar energy systems. Freestanding solar panels shall be permitted if they comply with all of the following standards the standards listed in the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance. Ground or pole mounted solar energy systems shall not exceed the maximum height, when oriented at maximum tilt, for the zoning district in which it is located. Freestanding solar panels used as accessory to agricultural uses and which the energy generated from the solar panels is

consumed on-site shall be exempt from building permits. The use of freestanding solar panels for on-site energy consumption shall comply will all applicable federal, state, and local laws and the rules of the local electrical utility. (Updated 5/14/18)

(Properties considered agriculturally exempt as defined in State Statute from building permits are further exempt from these standards with the exception of #3 listed below):

- 1. The proposed system is no larger than necessary to provide 120 percent of the electrical and/or thermal energy requirements of the structure to which it is accessory as determined by a contractor licensed to install photovoltaic and thermal solar energy systems.
- 2. The solar panels and supporting framework shall not exceed 12' in all districts with the exception of the agricultural district as measured from adjoining grade at base to the highest elevation of the equipment.
- 3. The solar energy system including any appurtenant equipment is not located within any required setback areas within the respective zoning district.
- 4.—If the solar panels are visible from off-site, the solar panels are not-located within 150 feet of a dwelling located on a lot other than the lot on which the solar energy system is located unless:
 - a. There are appropriate facades, walls, fences or landscaping that screen the solar panels and supporting framework from unobstructed view.
 - b. Reflection angles from collector surfaces are oriented away from neighboring windows.
 - c. The panels are mounted as close as possible to the ground while allowing adequate drainage and preventing vegetation from shading the panels.
- 5. The solar panels are located so that they are not readily visible from public viewing areas including parks, roads and trails located to the south of the site.
- C. Solar Gardens. Solar gardens shall be allowed in all zoning districts and shall require a special use permit whether accessory or principal use of the property subject to the following requirements:
 - 1. The requirement for a special use permit may be waived, provided the solar garden's owner/lessee obtains and records with the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department signed and notarized affidavits agreeing that the need for a special use permit be waived from all property

owners adjoining the zoning lot on which the solar garden is to be located (as determined by the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department). (Updated 5/24/18)

- 2. Unless otherwise noted in the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance, solar gardens must comply with all required standards for structures in the district in which the system is located.
- 3. Rooftop community systems are permitted in all zoning districts where buildings are permitted.
- 4. Ground-mount community solar energy gardens must be less than **or equal** to twenty (20) acres in total size. Ground-mount solar developments covering more than twenty (20) acres shall be considered solar farms. (Updated 5/14/18)
- 5. Solar gardens are subject to Kendall County's Stormwater Management Ordinance and NPDES permit requirements.
- 6. An interconnection agreement must be completed with the electric utility in whose service territory the system is located.
- 7. For solar gardens located within 500 feet of an airport or within the approach zones of an airport, the applicant must complete and provide the results of the Solar Glare Hazard Analysis Tool (SGHAT) for the Airport Traffic Control Tower cab and final approach paths, consistent with the Interim Policy, FAA Review of Solar Energy Projects on Federally Obligated Airports, or most recent version adopted by the FAA. (Updated 5/14/18)
- 8. Ground-mount systems must comply with all required standards for structures in the district in which the system is located. All solar gardens shall also be in compliance with all applicable local, state and federal regulatory codes, including the State of Illinois Uniform Building Code, as amended, and the National Electric Code, as amended. Also, Health Department requirements for wells and septic systems must be met. (Updated 5/14/18).
- D. Solar Farms. Ground-mount solar energy systems that are the primary use on the lot, designed for providing energy to off-site uses or export to the wholesale market are permitted under the following standards:
 - 1. Solar farms shall require a special use permit in the A-1 Agricultural District. Unless otherwise noted in the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance, solar farms must comply with all the required standards for structures in the district in which the system is located. (Updated 5/24/18)

- 2. The solar array and all components of the solar collector system in a solar farm shall be kept at least one hundred feet (100') from a property line or right of way. However, this requirement may be walved, provided the solar farm's owner/lessee obtains, and records with the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department, signed and notarized affidavits agreeing that the minimum setback be waived, from all property owners and affected road authorities adjoining the zoning lot on which the solar farm is to be located (as determined by the Kendall County, Planning, Building and Zoning Department). However, in no instance shall any part of the solar farm be located within fifty feet (50') of any of the aforementioned items. Unless otherwise noted in the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance, solar farms must comply with all required standards for structures in the district in which the system is located. (Updated 5/24/18)
- 3. Solar farms are subject to Kendali County's Stormwater Management Ordinance and NPDES permit requirements.
- 4. Top soils shall not be removed during development, unless part of a remediation effort. Soils shall be planted to and maintained in perennial vegetation to prevent erosion, manage run off and build soil. A plan must be approved by the Kendall County Soil and Water Conservation District and paid for by the developer. Applicable noxious weed ordinances shall be followed. Due to potential County liability under the Illinois Endangered Species Protection Act (520 ILCS 10/11(b)), it is required that any crops or vegetation planted be in compliance with all federal and state laws protecting endangered species. This will also include pollinators such as bees. A report showing demonstration of plan compliance shall be submitted annually and paid for by the developer. (Updated 5/14/18)
- 5. A qualified engineer shall certify that the foundation and design of the solar panels racking and support is within accepted professional standards, given local soil and climate conditions.
- 6. All solar farms shall be in compliance with all applicable local, state and federal regulatory codes and the National Electric Code, as amended.
- 7. Power and communication lines running between banks of solar panels and to nearby electric substations or interconnections with buildings shall be buried underground. Exemptions may be granted by Kendall County in instances where shallow bedrock, water courses, or other elements of the natural landscape interfere with the ability to bury lines or distance makes undergrounding infeasible, at the discretion of the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department. In addition, the Illinois Department of Agriculture (IDOA) has established standards and policies in the Agricultural Impact Mitigation Agreements (AIMA) regarding the

- construction or burial of electric transmission lines which should be agreed to and adhered to between the landowner and the developer.
- 8. A detailed site plan for both existing and proposed conditions must be submitted, showing location of all solar arrays, other structures, property lines, rights-of-way, service roads, floodplains, wetlands and other protected natural resources, topography, farm tile, electric equipment, fencing, and screening materials and all other characteristics requested by Kendall County. The site plan should also show all zoning districts and overlay districts.
- 9. For solar farms located within five hundred feet (500') of an airport or within approach zones of an airport, the applicant must complete and provide the results of the Solar Glare Hazard Analysis Tool (SGHAT) for the Airport Traffic Control Tower cab and final approach paths, consistent with the Interim Policy, FAA Review of Solar Energy Projects on Federally Obligated Airports, or most recent version adopted by the FAA. (Updated 5/14/18)
- 10. Solar farm developers shall be required to initiate a natural resource review consultation with the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) through the department's online, EcoCat program. Areas reviewed through this process will be endangered species and wetlands. The cost of the EcoCat consultation will be borne by the developer. (Updated 5/14/18)
- E. Setback Requirements. Unless otherwise stated in the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance, the setback requirements for all solar energy systems shall meet the structure minimum setback requirements when the solar energy system is oriented at any and all positions.
 - No solar energy system shall be located in any front yard of any residentially zoned or used property.
- F. Design Standards. Active solar energy systems shall be designed to conform to the County's Land Resource Management Plan and to blend into the architecture of the building or may be required to be screened from the routine view from public rights-of-way other than alleys. Screening may be required to the extent it does not affect the operation of the system. The color of the solar collector is not required to be consistent with other roofing materials.
 - 1. Building integrated photovoltaic solar energy systems shall be allowed regardless of whether the system is visible from the public right-of-way, provided the building component in which the system is integrated meets all required setback, land use or performance standards for the district in which the building is located.

- 2. Solar energy systems using roof mounting devices or ground-mount solar energy systems shall not be restricted if the system is not visible from the closest edge of any public right-of-way or immediately adjacent to a residential structure.
- 3. All solar energy systems using a reflector to enhance solar production shall minimize glare from the reflector affecting adjacent or nearby properties. Measures to minimize glare include selective placement of the system, screening on the north side of the solar array, modifying the orientation of the system, reducing use of the reflector system, or other remedies that limit glare.
- 4. Damaged field drain tile shall be repaired or rerouted on a timetable approved by the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department. (Updated 5/24/18)
- 5. For solar units located within 500 feet of an airport or within approach zones of an airport, the applicant must complete and provide the results of the Solar Glare Hazard Analysis Tool (SGHAT) for the Airport Traffic Control Tower cab and final approach paths, consistent with the Interim Policy, FAA Review of Solar Energy Projects on Federally Obligated Airports, or most recent version adopted by the FAA. (Updated 5/14/18)
- G. Coverage. Roof or building mounted solar energy systems, excluding building-integrated systems, shall allow for adequate roof access for fire-fighting purposes to the south-facing or flat roof upon which the panels are mounted. Ground-mount private solar energy systems shall be exempt from impervious surface calculations if the soil under the collector is not compacted and maintained in vegetation. Foundations, gravel, or compacted soils are considered impervious.
- H. Plan Approval Required. All solar energy systems shall require administrative plan approval by the Kendall County Building Official via the review of the application for a building permit.
 - 1. Plan applications for solar energy systems shall be accompanied by horizontal and vertical (elevation) drawings. The drawings must show the location of the system on the building or on the property for a ground-mount system including the property lines.
 - 2. For all roof-mounted systems other than a flat roof, the elevation must show the highest finished slope of the solar collector and the slope of the finished roof surface on which it is mounted.
 - 3. For flat roof applications, a drawing shall be submitted showing the distance to the roof edge and any parapets on the building shall identify

the height of the building on the street frontage side, the shortest distance of the system from the street frontage edge of the building, and the highest finished height of the solar collector above the finished surface of the roof.

- 4. Applications that meet the design requirements of the Kendali County Zoning Ordinance and do not require an administrative variance shall be granted administrative approval by the Zoning Administrator and not require Planning, Building and Zoning Committee review. Plan approval does not indicate compliance with Building or Electrical Codes.
- I. Approved Solar Components. Electric solar energy system components must have a UL listing approved equivalent and solar hot water systems must have an SRCC rating.
- J. Compliance with Building Code. All active solar energy systems shall meet approval of County building officials; solar thermal systems shall comply with HVAC-related requirements of the Illinois State Energy Code. All County adopted building codes will apply and take precedence where applicable.
- K. Compliance with State Plumbing Code. Solar thermal systems shall comply with applicable Illinois State Plumbing Code requirements. (Updated 5/14/18)
- L. Compliance with State Energy Code. All photovoltaic systems and solar thermal systems shall comply with the Illinois State Energy Code. (Updated 5/14/18)
- M. Utility Notification. All grid-intertie solar energy systems shall comply with the interconnection requirements of the electric utility. Off-grid systems are exempt from this requirement.
- N. Building Permit Requirements and Fees. All solar energy systems will be required to have a Kendall County Building Permit before any work can be started. A written plan and a plat/drawing for the proposed solar energy system shall be provided with the Building Permit Application. The plat/drawing must show the location of the system on the building or on the property, (for a ground-mount system show arrangement of panels), with all property lines and set back footages indicated. Fees for processing the applications for building permits shall be submitted to and collected by the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department as follows:

0-	10 kilowatts (kW)	\$150.00
11-	50 kilowatts (kW)	\$300.00
51-	100 kilowatts (kW)	\$600.00
101-	500 kilowatts (kW)	\$1,200.00
501-	1,000 kilowatts (kW)	\$2,750.00
1,001	-2,000 kilowatts (kW)	\$6,000.00

Over 2,000 kilowatts (kW)

\$6,000.00 + \$200.00 for each additional 0-100 kilowatts

Any solar energy system that construction has started before a Building Permit has been applied and paid for will be charged double the permit fee. The above fees do not apply to solar energy systems used to generate energy for on-site consumption of energy for agricultural purposes. (Updated 5/14/18)

O. Liability Insurance and Indemnification.

- 1. For Solar Farms and Solar Gardens, commencing with the issuance of building permits, the Applicant, Owner, or Operator shall maintain a current general liability policy covering bodily injury and property damage with limits of at least Three Million Dollars (\$3 Million) per occurrence and Five Million Dollars (\$5 Million) in the aggregate. Such insurance may be provided pursuant to a plan of self- insurance, by a party with a net worth of Twenty Million Dollars (\$20 Million) or more. The County shall be named as an individual insured on the policy to the extent the county is entitled to indemnification.
- 2. For private/individual SES(s), commencing with the issuance of building permits, the applicant or owner shall maintain a current liability policy covering bodily injuries and any damage that may occur, on their home owner's policy or other applicable policy as approved by the Planning, Building and Zoning Department. (Remove Per Brian Holdiman)
- 3. Any SES(s), applicant, owner, or operator, whether individual or commercial, shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County and its officials, employees, and agents (collectively and individually, the "Indemnified Parties") from and against any and all claims, demands, losses, suits, causes of actions, damages, injuries, costs, expenses, and liabilities whatsoever, including reasonable attorney's fees, except to the extent arising in whole or part out of negligence or intentional acts of such Indemnified Parties (such liabilities together known as "liability") arising out of applicant, owner, or operators selection, construction, operation, and removal of the SES(s) and affiliated equipment including, without limitation, liability for property damage or personal injury (including death), whether said liability is premised on contract or on tort (including without limitation strict liability or negligence). This general indemnification shall not be construed as limited or qualifying the County's other indemnification rights available under the law.

P. Decommissioning Plan.

1. Upon the request of the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department, an owner of a commercial solar energy system must provide

documentation, within thirty (30) days, that the solar energy system is still in use. If the solar energy system is not in use, the owner of the system shall have 180 days, after notification from the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department, to remove the solar energy system from the property. (Updated 5/14/18)

- 2. A decommissioning plan shall be required at the time of applying for all solar farms and solar gardens to ensure that the facilities are properly removed after their useful life.
- 3. Decommission of solar panels must occur in the event they are not in use for ninety (90) consecutive days.
- 4. The owner or operator will have six (6) months to complete the decommissioning plan after operation of a solar farm or solar garden ceases.
- 5. The decommissioning plan shall include provisions for removal of all structures and foundations, restoration of soil and vegetation, and a plan ensuring financial resources will be available to fully decommission the site.
- 6. The Kendall County Board may shall require the posting of a bond, letter of credit, or the establishment of an escrow account to ensure the proper decommissioning. The posting of a bond may be required prior to the issuance of a building permit for the facility. (Updated 9/10/18)
- 7. In the event that the State of Illinois enacts a law with regards to the decommissioning of a solar farm, the strictest requirements shall prevail.

Q. Other Requirements.

- 1. Upon request from the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department, an owner of a commercial solar energy system must provide documentation, within thirty (30) calendar days, that the solar energy system is still in use. If it is not still in use, the owner of the system will have one hundred eighty (180) calendar days, after notification from the Planning, Building and Zoning Department, to remove the solar energy system from the property. (Updated 5/14/18)
- 2. Upon request from the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department, the owner or operator of a solar farm or a solar garden must submit, within fourteen (14) calendar days, a current operation and maintenance report to the Department.

- 3. In all undeveloped areas, the solar energy developer will be required to complete a consultation with both the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency (IHPA) and the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) through the Department's online EcoCat Program. The cost of this consultation shall be at the developer's expense. The final certificate from EcoCat shall be provided to the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department before a permit or special use permit will be issued.
- 4. No fencing is required; however, if installed on the property the fencing shall have a maximum height of eight (8) feet. The fence shall contain appropriate warning signage that is posted such that is clearly visible on the site.
- 5. Any lighting for solar farms or solar gardens shall be installed for security and safety purposes only. Except for lighting that is required by the FCC or FAA, all lighting shall be shielded so that no glare extends substantially beyond the boundaries of the facility.
- 6. Reflection angles for solar collectors shall be oriented such that they do not project glare onto adjacent properties.
- 7. Electric solar energy system components must have a UL listing and must be designed with anti-reflective coating(s).
- 8. Solar energy systems must be in compliance with all State of Illinois Plumbing and Energy Codes.
- 9. For solar energy systems located within five hundred feet (500') of an airport or within approach zones of an airport, the applicant must complete and provide the results of the Solar Glare Hazard Analysis Tool (SGHAT) for the Airport Traffic Control Tower cab and final approach paths, consistent with the Interim Policy, FAA Review of Solar Energy Projects on Federally Obligated Airports, or most recent version adopted by the FAA (Updated 5/14/18).

Amend Section 7.01.D by adding:

"54. Solar Gardens subject to the provisions of Section 4.00 of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance.

55. Solar Farms subject to the provisions of Section 4.00 of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance."

Amend Section 8.02.C by adding:

"19. Solar Gardens subject to the provisions of Section 4.00 of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance."

Amend Section 8.03.H.1 by adding

"p. Solar Gardens subject to the provisions of Section 4.00 of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance."

Amend Section 8.09.B by adding

"9. Solar Gardens subject to the provisions of Section 4.00 of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance."

Amend Section 9.02.C

"15. Solar Gardens subject to the provisions of Section 4.00 of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance."

Amend Section 9.03.C

TEXT AMENDMENT TO SECTIONS 3.02, 4.18, 7.01.D, 8.02.C 8.03.H.1, 8.09.B, 9.02.C, 9.03.C, 9.04.C, 9.05.C, 9.06.F, 9.07.C, AND 10.03.B OF THE KENDALL COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE BY AMENDING KENDALL COUNTY'S SOLAR PANEL ZONING REGULATIONS

<u>WHEREAS</u>, Section 13.07 of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance permits the Kendall County Board to approve text amendments and provides the procedure through which text amendments are granted; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, Section 13.08 of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance contains the procedures for approving special use permits, major and minor amendments to special use permits, and revocations of special use permits, but does not contain specific procedures for the renewal of special use permits;

<u>WHEREAS</u>, on March 12, 2018, the Kendall Count Planning, Building and Zoning Committee, hereinafter be referred to as "Petitioner", submitted a text amendment to the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance amending Kendall County's Solar Panel Zoning Regulations; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, following due and proper notice by publication in the Kendall County Record on July 12, 2018, the Kendall County Zoning Board of Appeals conducted a public hearing on July 30, 2018, at 7:00 p.m., in the County Office Building at 111 W. Fox Street in Yorkville, at which the Petitioner and the Petitioner's representative presented evidence, testimony, and exhibits in support of the requested text amendment and zero members of the public asked questions or testified in favor or testified in opposition to the request; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, based on the evidence, testimony, and exhibits, the Kendall County Zoning Board of Appeals has recommended approval of the text amendment on July 30, 2018; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Committee of the Kendall County Board has reviewed the testimony presented at the aforementioned public hearing, and has forwarded to the Kendall County Board a recommendation of approval of the requested text amendment; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the Kendall County Board has considered the recommendations of the Planning, Building and Zoning Committee and the Kendall County Zoning Board of Appeals, and has determined that said petition is in conformance with the provisions and intent of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF KENDALL COUNTY, ILLINOIS, that the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance be amended as follows:

- I. Recitals: The recitals set forth above are incorporated as if fully set forth herein.
- II. Amended Text: Section 3.02 is amended by adding the following terms and definitions:

"ACTIVE SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM. A solar energy system whose primary purpose is to harvest energy by transforming solar energy into another form of energy or transferring heat from a collector to another medium using mechanical, electrical, or chemical means.

BUILDING-INTEGRATED SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEMS. An active solar energy system that is an integral part of a principal or accessory building, rather than a separate mechanical device, replacing or

substituting for an architectural or structural component of the building. Building-integrated systems include but are not limited to photovoltaic or hot water solar energy systems that are contained within roofing materials, windows, skylights, and awnings.

GRID-INTERIE SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM. A photovoltaic solar energy system that is connected to an electric circuit served by an electric utility company.

GROUND MOUNT SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM. A solar energy system mounted on a rack or pole that rests on or is attached to the ground.

OFF-GRID SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM. A photovoltaic solar energy system in which the circuits energized by the solar energy system are not electrically connected in any way to electric circuits that are served by an electric utility company.

PASSIVE SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM. A solar energy system that captures solar light or heat without transforming it to another form of energy or transferring the energy via a heat exchanger.

PHOTOVOLTAIC SYSTEM. An active solar energy system that converts solar energy directly into electricity.

ROOF MOUNT SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM. A solar energy system that is mounted on a rack that is fastened onto a building roof.

SOLAR ACCESS. Unobstructed access to direct sunlight on a lot or building through the entire year, including access across adjacent parcel air rights, for the purpose of capturing direct sunlight to operate a solar energy system.

SOLAR COLLECTOR. An assembly, structure, and the associated equipment and housing, designed for gathering, concentrating, or absorbing direct and indirect solar energy for which the primary purpose is to convert or transform solar radiant energy into thermal, mechanical, chemical or electrical energy.

SOLAR ENERGY. Radiant energy received from the sun that can be collected in the form of heat or light by a solar collector.

SOLAR ENERGY EASEMENT. An easement that limits the height or location, or both, of permissible development on the burdened land in terms of a structure or vegetation, or both, for the purpose of providing access for the benefited land to wind or sunlight passing over the burdened land.

SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM (SES). All components required to become a complete assembly or structure that will convert solar energy into electricity for use.

SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM ADDITION. A private solar energy system which is structurally attached to a building or structure on the zoning lot on which said system is located. Said system shall be considered part of the building and shall comply with all provisions of this ordinance pertaining thereto.

SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM, PRIVATE. A collection of one (1) or more solar collectors designed for use by the occupant(s) of the zoning lot on which said system is located; excess power generation is limited to net metering or similar technology with regulations set by the local power utility.

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community, county, and state. Private solar energy system equipment shall conform to applicable industry standards, and applicants for building permits for private solar energy systems shall submit certificates from equipment manufacturers that the equipment is manufactured in compliance with industry standards.

SOLAR FARM. A commercial facility that converts sunlight into electricity, whether by photovoltaics (PV), concentrating solar thermal devices (CST), or other conversion technology, for the primary purpose of wholesale sales of generated electricity. A solar farm is the principal land use for the parcel on which it is located.

SOLAR GARDEN. A commercial solar-electric (photovoltaic) array, of no more than 20 acres in size, that provides retail electric power (or a financial proxy for retail power) to multiple households or businesses located off-site from the location of the solar energy system.

SOLAR HEAT EXCHANGER. A component of a solar energy device that is used to transfer heat from one substance to another, either liquid or gas.

SOLAR HOT AIR SYSTEM. An active solar energy system (also referred to as Solar Air Heat or Solar Furnace) that includes a solar collector to provide direct supplemental space heating by heating and re-circulating conditioned building air.

SOLAR HOT WATER SYSTEM. A system (also referred to as Solar Thermal) that includes a solar collector and a heat exchanger that heats or preheats water for building heating systems or other hot water needs, including residential domestic hot water and hot water for commercial processes.

SOLAR MOUNTING DEVICES. Racking, frames, or other devices that allow the mounting of a solar collector onto a roof surface or the ground.

SOLAR STORAGE UNIT. A component of a solar energy device that is used to store solar generated electricity or heat for later use."

- III. Amended Text: Section 4.18 is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:
 - "A. Roof Mounted for On-Site Energy Consumption. Solar panels located on the roof of an existing structure shall be permitted in all districts. Roof mounted solar energy systems shall not extend beyond the exterior perimeter of the building on which the system is mounted. Roof mounted solar energy systems shall not exceed the maximum allowed height in any zoning district. Roof mounted or building integrated private solar energy systems for residential or business use shall be considered an accessory use in all zoning districts where there is a principal structure and shall meet the regulations of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance. Roof mounted solar panels used as accessory to agricultural uses and which the energy generated from the solar panels is consumed on-site shall be exempt from building permits. The use of roof mounted solar panels for on-site energy consumption shall comply will all applicable federal, state, and local laws and the rules of the local electrical utility.
 - B. Freestanding for On-Site Energy Consumption. Solar panels located on the ground or attached to a framework located on the ground shall be classified as accessory structures in all zoning districts provided that the system is no larger than necessary to provide one hundred twenty percent (120%) of the electrical and/or thermal requirements of the structure to which it is accessory as determined by a contractor licensed to install photovoltaic and thermal solar energy systems. Freestanding solar panels

shall be permitted if they comply with the standards listed in the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance. Ground or pole mounted solar energy systems shall not exceed the maximum height, when oriented at maximum tilt, for the zoning district in which it is located. Freestanding solar panels used as accessory to agricultural uses and which the energy generated from the solar panels is consumed on-site shall be exempt from building permits. The use of freestanding solar panels for on-site energy consumption shall comply will all applicable federal, state, and local laws and the rules of the local electrical utility.

- C. Solar Gardens. Solar gardens shall be allowed in all zoning districts and shall require a special use permit whether accessory or principal use of the property subject to the following requirements:
- 1. Unless otherwise noted in the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance, solar gardens must comply with all required standards for structures in the district in which the system is located.
- 2. Rooftop community systems are permitted in all zoning districts where buildings are permitted.
- 3. Ground-mount community solar energy gardens must be less than or equal to twenty (20) acres in total size. Ground-mount solar developments covering more than twenty (20) acres shall be considered solar farms.
- 4. Solar gardens are subject to Kendall County's Stormwater Management Ordinance and NPDES permit requirements.
- 5. An interconnection agreement must be completed with the electric utility in whose service territory the system is located.
- 6. Ground-mount systems must comply with all required standards for structures in the district in which the system is located. All solar gardens shall also be in compliance with all applicable local, state and federal regulatory codes, including the National Electric Code, as amended. Also, Health Department requirements for wells and septic systems must be met.
- D. Solar Farms. Ground-mount solar energy systems that are the primary use on the lot, designed for providing energy to off-site uses or export to the wholesale market are permitted under the following standards:
- 1. Unless otherwise noted in the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance, solar farms must comply with all required standards for structures in the district in which the system is located.
- 2. Solar farms are subject to Kendall County's Stormwater Management Ordinance and NPDES permit requirements.
- 3. Top soils shall not be removed during development, unless part of a remediation effort. Soils shall be planted to and maintained in perennial vegetation to prevent erosion, manage run off and build soil. A plan must be approved by the Kendall County Soil and Water Conservation District and paid for by the developer. Applicable noxious weed ordinances shall be followed. Due to potential County liability under the Illinois Endangered Species Protection Act (520 ILCS 10/11(b)), it is required that any crops or vegetation planted be in compliance with all federal and state laws protecting endangered species. This will also include

pollinators such as bees. A report showing demonstration of plan compliance shall be submitted annually and paid for by the developer.

- A qualified engineer shall certify that the foundation and design of the solar panels racking and support is within accepted professional standards, given local soil and climate conditions.
- 5. All solar farms shall be in compliance with all applicable local, state and federal regulatory codes and the National Electric Code, as amended.
- 6. Power and communication lines running between banks of solar panels and to nearby electric substations or interconnections with buildings shall be buried underground. Exemptions may be granted by Kendall County in instances where shallow bedrock, water courses, or other elements of the natural landscape interfere with the ability to bury lines or distance makes undergrounding infeasible, at the discretion of the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department. In addition, the Illinois Department of Agriculture (IDOA) has established standards and policies in the Agricultural Impact Mitigation Agreements (AIMA) regarding the construction or burial of electric transmission lines which should be agreed to and adhered to between the landowner and the developer.
- 7. A detailed site plan for both existing and proposed conditions must be submitted, showing location of all solar arrays, other structures, property lines, rights-of-way, service roads, floodplains, wetlands and other protected natural resources, topography, farm tile, electric equipment, fencing, and screening materials and all other characteristics requested by Kendall County. The site plan should also show all zoning districts and overlay districts.
- E. Setback Requirements. Unless otherwise stated in the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance, the setback requirements for all solar energy systems shall meet the structure minimum setback requirements when the solar energy system is oriented at any and all positions.

No solar energy system shall be located in any front yard of any residentially zoned or used property.

- F. Design Standards. Active solar energy systems shall be designed to conform to the County's Land Resource Management Plan and to blend into the architecture of the building or may be required to be screened from the routine view from public rights-of-way other than alleys. Screening may be required to the extent it does not affect the operation of the system. The color of the solar collector is not required to be consistent with other roofing materials.
- 1. Building integrated photovoltaic solar energy systems shall be allowed regardless of whether the system is visible from the public right-of-way, provided the building component in which the system is integrated meets all required setback, land use or performance standards for the district in which the building is located.
- Solar energy systems using roof mounting devices or ground-mount solar energy systems shall
 not be restricted if the system is not visible from the closest edge of any public right-of-way or
 immediately adjacent to a residential structure.
- 3. All solar energy systems using a reflector to enhance solar production shall minimize glare from the reflector affecting adjacent or nearby properties. Measures to minimize glare include selective placement of the system, screening on the north side of the solar array, modifying the

orientation of the system, reducing use of the reflector system, or other remedies that limit glare.

- Damaged field drain tile shall be repaired or rerouted on a timetable approved by the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department.
- G. Coverage. Roof or building mounted solar energy systems, excluding building-integrated systems, shall allow for adequate roof access for fire-fighting purposes to the south-facing or flat roof upon which the panels are mounted. Ground-mount private solar energy systems shall be exempt from impervious surface calculations if the soil under the collector is not compacted and maintained in vegetation. Foundations, gravel, or compacted soils are considered impervious.
- H. Plan Approval Required. All solar energy systems shall require administrative plan approval by the Kendall County Building Official via the review of the application for a building permit.
- 1. Plan applications for solar energy systems shall be accompanied by horizontal and vertical (elevation) drawings. The drawings must show the location of the system on the building or on the property for a ground-mount system including the property lines.
- 2. For all roof-mounted systems other than a flat roof, the elevation must show the highest finished slope of the solar collector and the slope of the finished roof surface on which it is mounted.
- 3. For flat roof applications, a drawing shall be submitted showing the distance to the roof edge and any parapets on the building shall identify the height of the building on the street frontage side, the shortest distance of the system from the street frontage edge of the building, and the highest finished height of the solar collector above the finished surface of the roof.
- 4. Applications that meet the design requirements of the Kendall County Zoning Ordinance and do not require an administrative variance shall be granted administrative approval by the Zoning Administrator and not require Planning, Building and Zoning Committee review. Plan approval does not indicate compliance with Building or Electrical Codes.
- I. Approved Solar Components. Electric solar energy system components must have a UL listing approved equivalent and solar hot water systems must have an SRCC rating.
- J. Compliance with Building Code. All active solar energy systems shall meet approval of County building officials; solar thermal systems shall comply with HVAC-related requirements of the Illinois State Energy Code. All County adopted building codes will apply and take precedence where applicable.
- K. Utility Notification. All grid-intertie solar energy systems shall comply with the interconnection requirements of the electric utility. Off-grid systems are exempt from this requirement.
- L. Building Permit Requirements and Fees. All solar energy systems will be required to have a Kendall County Building Permit before any work can be started. A written plan and a plat/drawing for the proposed solar energy system shall be provided with the Building Permit Application. The plat/drawing must show the location of the system on the building or on the property, (for a ground-mount system show arrangement of panels), with all property lines and set back footages indicated.

Fees for processing the applications for building permits shall be submitted to and collected by the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department as follows:

0-	10 kilowatts (kW)	\$150.00
11-	50 kilowatts (kW)	\$300.00
51-	100 kilowatts (kW)	\$600.00
101-	500 kilowatts (kW)	\$1,200.00
501-	1,000 kilowatts (kW)	\$2,750.00
1,001-	2,000 kilowatts (kW)	\$6,000.00
Over 2,000 kilowatts (kW)		\$6,000.00 + \$200.00 for each additional 0-100 kilowatts

Any solar energy system that construction has started before a Building Permit has been applied and paid for will be charged double the permit fee. The above fees do not apply to solar energy systems used to generate energy for on-site consumption of energy for agricultural purposes.

M. Liability Insurance and Indemnification.

- 1. For Solar Farms and Solar Gardens, commencing with the issuance of building permits, the Applicant, Owner, or Operator shall maintain a current general liability policy covering bodily injury and property damage with limits of at least Three Million Dollars (\$3 Million) per occurrence and Five Million Dollars (\$5 Million) in the aggregate. Such insurance may be provided pursuant to a plan of self- insurance, by a party with a net worth of Twenty Million Dollars (\$20 Million) or more. The County shall be named as an individual insured on the policy to the extent the county is entitled to indemnification.
- 2. Any SES(s), applicant, owner, or operator, whether individual or commercial, shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County and its officials, employees, and agents (collectively and individually, the "Indemnified Parties") from and against any and all claims, demands, losses, suits, causes of actions, damages, injuries, costs, expenses, and liabilities whatsoever, including reasonable attorney's fees, except to the extent arising in whole or part out of negligence or intentional acts of such Indemnified Parties (such liabilities together known as "liability") arising out of applicant, owner, or operators selection, construction, operation, and removal of the SES(s) and affiliated equipment including, without limitation, liability for property damage or personal injury (including death), whether said liability is premised on contract or on tort (including without limitation strict liability or negligence). This general indemnification shall not be construed as limited or qualifying the County's other indemnification rights available under the law.

N. Decommissioning Plan.

- 1. Upon the request of the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department, an owner of a solar energy system must provide documentation, within thirty (30) days, that the solar energy system is still in use. If the solar energy system is not in use, the owner of the system shall have 180 days, after notification from the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department, to remove the solar energy system from the property.
- 2. A decommissioning plan shall be required at the time of applying for all solar farms and solar gardens to ensure that the facilities are properly removed after their useful life.

- 3. Decommission of solar panels must occur in the event they are not in use for ninety (90) consecutive days.
- 4. The owner or operator will have six (6) months to complete the decommissioning plan after operation of a solar farm or solar garden ceases.
- 5. The decommissioning plan shall include provisions for removal of all structures and foundations, restoration of soil and vegetation, and a plan ensuring financial resources will be available to fully decommission the site.
- 6. The Kendall County Board shall require the posting of a bond, letter of credit, or the establishment of an escrow account to ensure the proper decommissioning. The posting of a bond may be required prior to the issuance of a building permit for the facility.
- 7. In the event that the State of Illinois enacts a law with regards to the decommissioning of a solar farm, the strictest requirements shall prevail.

O. Other Requirements.

- 1. Upon request from the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department, the owner or operator of a solar farm or a solar garden must submit, within fourteen (14) calendar days, a current operation and maintenance report to the Department.
- 2. In all undeveloped areas, the solar energy developer will be required to complete a consultation with both the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency (IHPA) and the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) through the Department's online EcoCat Program. The cost of this consultation shall be at the developer's expense. The final certificate from EcoCat shall be provided to the Kendall County Planning, Building and Zoning Department before a permit or special use permit will be issued.
- 3. No fencing is required; however, if installed on the property the fencing shall have a maximum height of eight (8) feet. The fence shall contain appropriate warning signage that is posted such that is clearly visible on the site.
- 4. Any lighting for solar farms or solar gardens shall be installed for security and safety purposes only. Except for lighting that is required by the FCC or FAA, all lighting shall be shielded so that no glare extends substantially beyond the boundaries of the facility.
- 5. Reflection angles for solar collectors shall be oriented such that they do not project glare onto adjacent properties.
- 6. Electric solar energy system components must have a UL listing and must be designed with anti-reflective coating(s).
- 7. Solar energy systems must be in compliance with all State of Illinois Plumbing and Energy Codes.
- 8. For solar energy systems located within five hundred feet (500') of an airport or within approach zones of an airport, the applicant must complete and provide the results of the Solar

Glare Hazard Analysis Tool (SGHAT) for the Airport Traffic Control Tower cab and final approach paths, consistent with the Interim Policy, FAA Review of Solar Energy Projects on Federally Obligated Airports, or most recent version adopted by the FAA."
