UCCI LEGISLATIVE UPDATE July 13, 2017

As you are aware, on July 6, 2017, the Illinois House of Representatives, like the Illinois Senate, overrode the Governor's vetoes of Senate Bill 6 (Public Act 100-21), the appropriations bill; Senate Bill 9 (Public Act 100-22), the revenue bill; and Senate Bill 42 (Public Act 100-23).

What follows is a supplement to the summary distributed on July 11, 2017 with respect to legislative changes contained in SB 9.

SB 9 primarily consisted of increases in the personal and corporate income tax rates. The House passed amended SB 9 by a vote of 72 yeas, 45 nays, and 0 present. The Senate concurred with the House amendments (by a vote of 36 yeas, 18 nays, and 0 present). The Governor vetoed the bill, but both chambers overrode the Governor's veto (House: 71 yeas, 42 nays, and 0 present; Senate: 36 yeas, 19 nays, and 0 present). SB 9 is effective immediately upon override. However, the portions related to the new State Tax Lien Registration Act and Revised Uniform Unclaimed Property Act are effective January 1, 2018.

Income Tax Increase

The most controversial portions of SB 9 are the permanent increases in personal income tax from 3.75% to 4.95% and in the increase in the corporate tax rate from 5.25% to 7% for taxable period after June 30, 2017 and each taxable year thereafter.

Local Government Distributive Fund

SB 9 makes changes to the Illinois Income Tax Act that correspond with changes to the Local Government Distributive Fund ("LGDF") provided for in Senate Bill 42. Specifically, SB 9 modifies the deposits to be made from the General Revenue Fund to the LGDF from 9.23% to 6.06% of the net revenue realized from the particular tax imposed upon individuals, trusts, and estates during the preceding month and from 10% to 6.85% of the net revenue realized from the particular tax imposed upon corporations during the preceding month. In other words, SB 9 reduces the deposits into the LGDF to correspond to the lower disbursements provided for in Senate Bill 42.

Tax Credits

SB 9 reinstates the *Research and Development Tax Credit* by amending the provisions sunset date from January 1, 2016 to January 1, 2022. The General Assembly's stated intent in making this amendment is that this credit apply continuously for all tax years ending on or after December 31, 2004 and ending prior to January 1, 2022.

UCCI LEGISLATIVE UPDATE July 12, 2017

As you are aware, on July 6, 2017, the Illinois House of Representatives, like the Senate, overrode the Governor's vetoes of Senate Bill 6 (Public Act 100-21), the appropriations bill; Senate Bill 9 (Public Act 100-22), the revenue bill; and Senate Bill 42 (Public Act 100-23). All three pieces of legislation are effective immediately upon becoming law (with some exceptions in the revenue bill).

SB 42, like the other two budget related bills, was the subject of extensive amendments in the House (consisting of some 756 pages). As the budget implementation bill, SB 42 makes the changes in state laws necessary to implement the fiscal year 2018 budget recommendations. More specifically, SB 42 directs the State Comptroller to order the transfer and, upon that order, the State Treasurer shall transfer from various funds to other funds to carry out the business of the State consistent with the appropriation bill and other related laws. The House passed amended SB 42 by a vote of 73 yeas, 36 nays, and 0 present. The Senate concurred with the House amendments (by a vote of 36 yeas, 17 nays, and 0 present).

What follows is a supplement to the summary distributed on July 11, 2017 with respect to legislative changes contained in SB 42.

Fund Sweeps

As has been previously noted, SB 42 made extensive sweeps of monies from particular funds to the Audit Expense Fund. The Audit Expense Fund is used to pay actual costs attributable to audits, studies, and investigations as permitted or required by the Illinois State Auditing Act or specific action of the General Assembly. More importantly, the amounts transferred into this Audit Expense Fund will no longer be used for the original funds' purposes. Below is a summary of some notable and/or relevant funds from which money was transferred and the related purposes of those funds:

State Prompt Payment Act

The General Assembly has amended the State Prompt Payment Act to address a state agency's inability to meet is obligation of interest payments due to lack of appropriation by providing that "If an agency incurs an interest liability under this Act that is ordinarily payable from the Budget Stabilization Fund, but the agency has insufficient appropriation authority from the Budget Stabilization Fund to make the interest payment at the time the interest payment is due, the agency is authorized to pay the interest from its available appropriations from the General Revenue Fund." 30 ILCS 540/3-5.

Local Government Distributive Fund

In SB 42, the General Assembly has modified the process by which revenues are ultimately transferred into the Local Government Distributive Fund so that rather than first being placed into the General Revenue Fund after being collected and subsequently transferred, the collected revenues will now be "directly deposited into the Local Government Distributive Fund as the revenue is realized from the tax imposed." 35 ILCS 5/901(b). In other words, a separate act of the General Assembly should not be required for the funds to be distributed pursuant to the statutory formula. Simultaneously, the amount of deposits into the fund is being reduced by 10% but only for FY2018. As has been reported by the Illinois Department of Revenue and the Illinois Municipal League, the statutory reduction for this fiscal year will be offset by the direct transfers and accelerated payments resulting in fourteen (14) rather than twelve (12) deposits for the same fiscal year.

Downstate Transportation Act

Similar to the Local Government Distributive Fund, "those amounts required [pursuant to several sections of the Downstate Transportation Act] to be transferred by the Treasurer into the Downstate Public Transportation Fund from the General Revenue Fund shall be directly deposited into the Downstate Public Transportation Fund as the revenues are realized from the taxes indicated." 30 ILCS 740/2-3(a). Additionally, the FY2018 deposits into the Fund are being reduced by 10%.

Pensions

SB 42 includes amendments to the Illinois Pension Code (40 ILCS 5/1-1 et seq.) reminiscent of Senate President Cullerton's previously circulated "Consideration" plan. The former consideration plan would require current Tier 2 participants to choose between having future pay increases count toward their pensions, but forgoing the automatic 3% compounded raises in their retirement annuity payment, or keeping the automatic 3% raises in retirement, but giving up future pay increases during employment that would otherwise count toward their retirement benefits. The recent amendments to the Pension Code do not modify any of the benefits of Tier 1 members and retirees. Rather, SB 42 creates a new Tier 3 system, consisting of a small defined benefit component coupled with a broader defined contribution component similar to what has been previously been offered to members of the State University Retirement System. This Tier 3 plan would be optional for new members not covered by social security and would allow current Tier 2 members to who are not covered by Social Security to elect this plan over their current Tier 2 plan. For other new hires, it appears this new Tier 3 would be the default; however, those new hires would have the option to irrevocably elect to participate in the former Tier 2 plan.

Since at least the spring of 2016, the Illinois Department of Revenue ("Department") has been seeking to secure additional revenues to in response to being "asked to provide increasingly more services via interagency agreements to other state and local government agencies." Moreover, in the Department's 2016 legislative materials that "[t]he legislative change [the Department] is seeking would permit the reimbursement received from the state or local government agency (prescribed via interagency agreement) to be deposited into the [TCAF]. The deposit into TCAF would then be utilized, subject to appropriation, to fund [the Department's] on-going operational expenses to provide services prescribed via inter-agency agreement." The Department, to its credit, distributed over \$8.5 billion to local governments in FY2015 and estimated in 2016 (based upon FY2017 projections at standard 2 percent fee rate) that this change would divert \$58 million to the TCAF. Without this change, those funds would have otherwise made their way to the units of local government identified above (albeit only due to the collection and administration by the Department).

The Illinois Promotion Act (Tourism)

The Illinois Promotion Act (the "Act") allows the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity ("DCEO") to:

[M]ake grants, subject to appropriation, from funds transferred into the Tourism Promotion Fund under subsection (1) of Section 4a to counties, municipalities, not-for-profit organizations, and local promotion groups and to assist such counties, municipalities and local promotion groups in the promotion of tourism attractions and tourism events. The Department, after review of the application and if satisfied that the program and proposed expenditures of the applicant appear to be in accord with the purposes of this Act, must grant to the applicant an amount not to exceed 60% of the proposed expenditures. 20 ILCS 665/5.

SB 42 changes to the Illinois Promotion Act to allow the State to make up the difference when the "the amount of revenue deposited into the Tourism Promotion Fund ... is less than 21% of the net revenue realized from the Hotel Operators' Occupation Tax during the preceding month." Of the amounts appropriated from the Tourism Promotion Fund, 62.5% are required to go to local promotion groups, municipalities, and counties <u>not</u> wholly or partially within any county of more than 1 million population; and 37.5% to local promotion groups, municipalities, and counties wholly or partially within any county of more than 1 million population. 20 ILCS 665/8 (emphasis added).
