Wednesday, August 17, 2016 MEETING MINUTES

<u>Call to Order</u> – The meeting was called to order by Committee Chair Jeff Wehrli at 4:02p.m.

Committee Members Present: Jeff Wehrli – here, Matthew Prochaska – here, Lynn Cullick - here. With three members present, a quorum was established to conduct committee business.

<u>Approval of Agenda</u> – Motion made by Member Prochaska to approve the agenda, second by Member Cullick. <u>With three in agreement, the motion carried</u>.

<u>Approval of Last Month's Meeting Minutes</u> – Member Prochaska made a motion to approve the minutes from July 27, 2016, second by Member Cullick. <u>With three present in agreement, the motion carried</u>.

<u>Census Report</u> – Written report provided.

<u>Operations Report</u> – Laura Pawson reported they are now fully-staffed, adoptions are going well, and they continue to receive a lot of pictures and updates.

Mr. Wilkins stated that they have applied for the permit from the City of Yorkville on Tuesday, and once they have received the permit, they will set the date for delivery and the vendor will begin work on the trailer. Facilities Management will work on the electrical, transformer, the skirting, the ramp and the fence.

Ms. Pawson also reported that a Boy Scout will be doing some minor landscaping work around the facility as part of his Eagle Scout project.

<u>Accounting Report</u> – Jeff Wilkins reviewed the monthly financial report with the committee, and stated that it was another good month for revenues although slightly behind from last year. Mr. Wilkins said the rabies tag sales is ahead of last year.

New Business

 Animal Control Budgets – Jeff Wilkins reviewed the proposed FY2017 budgets with the committee.

After discussion, the committee agreed that some of the funds collected for the County Animal Population Control Fund should be used to develop a Feral Cat program. Ms. Pawson will research to see if the County Animal Control funds can be used to develop a feral cat program, will research other county facilities programs to see how they operate, and will begin making a plan for Kendall County.

We guessed her age a about 1-2 years old. We gave her the name "Queen Bee" and we would soon come to realize that her new name suited her well. We gave her a big soft bed to make her kennel as comfortable as possible during her stay with us. Sadly and to our dismay no one came forward as the owner of Queen Bee. This beauty showed us from the start that she was a very loving and loyal companion, but also that she had a mind of her own. She was very anxious in the kennel and escaping from it was very much her focus, but who could blame her. She also made it clear that she did not care for the company of most other dogs by repeatedly barking and growling at others. To our surprise, however, she did befriend her kennel neighbor, a small female Poodle mix named Guilda. She seemed to enjoy Guilda's company and had her mind made up that she was to be the only dog welcome in Queen Bees world. The time came when we assessed Queen Bee for

The State of Illinois requires that all dogs be vaccinated against rabies by a licensed veterinarian. Compliance with this law is monitored through the issuance of rables tags for all dogs residing in the County. All dogs are required to wear their rabies tags when off of the owner's property. If a pet is lost, rabies tags also provide an excellent means of identifying your pet.


