
Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 21(b) and (c) and Local Rule 1.25, the following felony cases may be assigned by the presiding judge to be heard by Judge McAdams on Thursday afternoons beginning at 1:00 p.m. on days when court is in session. Cases that are assigned to this court call shall be heard in Courtroom 111, or such other room as is specially assigned. This Order is effective April 1, 2015.

The cases which may be assigned to the Thursday afternoon court call before Judge McAdams must have the approval of the presiding judge, and may include cases which meet the following criteria:

1. The defendant is a Kendall County Resident; and
2. The defendant is charged with a probationable offense; and
3. The defendant is not currently charged with, nor has the defendant been convicted of a crime of violence within the past 10 years excluding incarceration time, including but not limited to: first degree murder, second degree murder, predatory criminal sexual assault of a child, aggravated criminal sexual assault, criminal sexual assault, armed robbery, aggravated arson, arson, aggravated kidnapping, kidnapping, aggravated battery resulting in great bodily harm or permanent disability, stalking, aggravated stalking, or any offense involving the discharge of a firearm.

A request to the presiding judge to assign a case to be heard by Judge McAdams may be brought *sua sponte*, or by the State's Attorney, the defendant's attorney, or by the defendant's request.
