Chairman Gryder opened the Stormwater Management Oversight Committee Public Hearing at 4:08 p.m.

Petition 19-40 Kendall County Forest Preserve District

Phil Smithmeyer, 6650 D Minkler Road, as a neighbor to the subject property, said that he walked the subject property to examine the stormwater runoff from the subject property to his

property. He did not witness any water overflow coming from the subject property onto his property. He supports the requested variance.

Member Hendrix asked Mr. Smithmeyer about the capacity of the subject property to handle additional rainfall. Mr. Smithmeyer responded that he has not completed an engineering study of the property, but felt that adequate capacity existed at the site and that the Forest Preserve District's activities on the property has increased capacity.

David Guritz, Kendall County Forest Preserve District, thanked Mr. Asselmeier for his assistance with the application. Mr. Guritz noted that neighboring property owners were notified of the hearing. He noted WBK's recommendation on the requested variance.

Member Kellogg made a motion, seconded by Member Hendrix, to recommend approval of the requested variance. With a voice vote of nine (9) ayes, the motion carried.

This proposal will go to the County Board on December 17, 2019.

Comments on Stormwater Management Related Regulations and Enforcement

The Committee reviewed the 2018 and 2019 survey responses from the townships.

Proposed Changes to the Kendall County Stormwater Management Ordinance

The proposed amendment to the definition of Bulletin 70 was approved earlier this year by the County Board. Staff does not have any additional proposed changes to the Stormwater Management Ordinance at this time. No other proposed changes were presented by the Committee or members of the public.



Re: Annual NPDES Survey Results

At the end of July, the County mailed the annual NPDES survey to the townships. 2020 marks the second year of sending and receiving responses from the townships.

Four (4) townships responded in 2020 compared to five (5) townships in 2019.

In summary, only Oswego Township utilized the stormwater information on the County's website. Only one (1) township utilized the volunteer opportunities page on the website. Electronics recycling was the most popular volunteer opportunity except in Oswego Township where river cleanups was the more popular volunteer opportunity. No illicit discharges were reported. The townships wanted the County to do more visual inspections and grab samples to identify and track illicit discharges. The results on training were mixed. Only Big Grove Township felt that necessary steps to reduce flooding was occurring.

The survey composite and comparison of 2019 and 2020 survey responses are attached.
