The Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation ("the Foundation") is awarding an 18-month grant of \$146,640 to the Kendall County Forest Preserve District ("the Grantee") for the above-referenced project that will provide:

Up to \$136,640 or 80% of the purchase price, whichever is less;

and

Up to \$10,000 to be applied towards restoration activities detailed in the project work plan submitted with the above-referenced grant request.

This letter defines the terms and conditions of the grant and constitutes the grant agreement ('the Agreement") between the Foundation and the Grantee. Please read it carefully. If the Grantee agrees to the terms and conditions in the Agreement, please return one complete counter-signed copy of the Agreement via your online account. Contact the Foundation if you have any questions.

### **Duration and Payment of Grant**

This grant is to be used during the period November 1, 2020 through April 30, 2022 (the "Grant Period"). The grant will be paid by the Foundation as follows:

Payment 1: \$136,640 for acquisition and \$7,500 for restoration as described above upon receipt of an official request for payment, which includes the following:

- b. a statement comparing actual expenditures against your approved Restoration Budget, saved as (b)FRestExp8133 Please note that this installment is a reimbursement to be paid after the Grantee has spent \$10,000 on restoration activities approved by the Foundation and covered in part or fully by this grant.)

The Foundation reserves the right to suspend, modify or cancel any payments that might otherwise be due under this grant, to require a refund of any unexpended grant funds, or both, if:

- 1. such action is necessary to comply with any applicable law or regulation;
- 2. the Grantee has used the grant funds for purposes other than as described in the Agreement or otherwise violated any part of the Agreement; and/or
- 3. the Grantee's performance under the grant has not been satisfactory.

The Foundation's judgment on these matters will be final and binding.

### Purpose and Use of Grant

This grant is for the Kendall County Forest Preserve District - The Conservation Foundation - Reservation Woods Acquisition (3-parcels +/- 12.2-acres) (the "Project") as described in the Project proposal and budget submitted to the Foundation by the Grantee. The Grantee confirms that this grant will be used solely for the specific tax-exempt purposes described in the

Project proposal and budget. No variance in the purchase price or acreage of the Project property and no substantial variance in any other aspects of the Project will be made without the Foundation's prior approval.

The Grantee agrees to maintain and care for the property as a natural area in perpetuity. Should the Grantee wish to transfer the Property to another entity, the Grantee agrees to inform the Foundation of such transfer no less than 60 days **before** the proposed transfer is to close. Such notice shall include documentation describing how the Project property (the "Property") will be protected in perpetuity for the purposes outlined in this Agreement. The receiving entity must be either a 501(c)(3) land conservation organization or a government agency serving Illinois residents. The transfer must be subject to a permanent conservation easement or deed restriction held and enforceable by the Grantee or other government or charitable conservation entity. Such conservation easement or deed restrictions shall provide that the Property be maintained as a natural area and be accessible to the public. Such public access may be subject to reasonable terms and conditions.

If the Grantee receives funds in exchange for the subsequent transfer of title of the Property, the Grantee agrees to inform the Foundation in writing of the amount of funds received and hereby agrees to spend those funds in the State of Illinois for the acquisition and restoration of natural areas and wildlife habitat. Prior to using any funds received for subsequent acquisition projects, the Grantee agrees to notify the Foundation in writing no less than 60 days in advance of the use of those funds, and to provide information on: (1)appraised value, (2)agreed upon purchase price, (3)descriptions of the additional natural areas to be purchased, and (4)plans for permanent protection of this additional land.

The Grantee also confirms that the Project is under its complete control and that it has and will exercise control over the process of selecting any sub-grantees, sub-contractors or consultants involved in the Project. The Grantee and the Foundation are not partners or joint venturers with respect to each other.

Furthermore, the Grantee agrees that funds from this grant will be used exclusively for tax exempt purposes as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and will not be used for any activities prohibited by law, including, without limitation, attempting to influence legislation or participating in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. The Grantee agrees that it and its employees, agents and sub-contractors will comply with all applicable federal, state, county and local laws, ordinances, regulations and codes in the performance of the Grantee's obligations under this Agreement.

The Foundation requires the Grantee to submit an interim report on this grant by **July 31, 2021**, 9 months after the start of the Grant Period, which should include the following:

IDOT is currently working on the design plans for the reconstruction of IL 71 from IL 126 up to Orchard Road. The attached Letter of Understanding indicates the willingness of the Forest Preserve to participate in the cost of the Shared Use Path (20% Forest Preserve). Currently there is no other participation items anticipated. IDOT has the preliminary plans from our Consultant and I will be sending them for your review via large file transfer due to the size of the pdf. Please let me know if you receive it.

The project begins about 2300' east of Wing Road in Yorkville. The first 1700' or so (Sta. 585+00 to Sta. 602±20) is with in the Yorkville City Limits. It appears that the Village of Oswego would have a ±2350' section of Shared Use Path between Oak Creek Dr. and Regal Oak Ct (approximately Sta. 715+25 to approximately Sta. 738+75) as well as section near the Orchard Rd/Minkler Rd intersection. Approximate length of the Forrest Preserves participation is 17700 ft.

Please verify my assessment of the limits.

This project has construction funding for FY 2021. Assuming the plans are ready and the funding does not change we will be putting this project on a late 2021 letting or early 2022 letting.

The Kendall County Trails & Greenways Plan, developed in partnership with all local municipalities, shows a proposed trail along Route 71. The Kendall County Forest Preserve District is requesting that IDOT acquire the right-of-way for a future 10' wide detached shared-use trail and a 5' wide detached sidewalk as part of the project scope.

The Forest Preserve District supports the trail project beginning at Harris Forest Preserve and continuing on the south side of Route 71 to the Route 47 intersection. At that signalized intersection, the trail should cross to the north side of Route 71, and then east across Route 47 and continue on the north side of Route 71 to Orchard Road. The only other location of trail on the south side of Route 71 would be to connect the Fields of Farm Colony HOA limestone trail to the signalized intersection of Van Emmon Road for a safe pedestrian crossing.

It is preliminary to assume that the Forest Preserve District can determine what portions of trail it can fund and maintain. The District can commit to working with other local agencies and IDOT as this project progresses to address funding availability and continued maintenance once IDOT completes the preliminary engineering and can provide an Engineer's Estimate of Probable Cost.

Dear Kendall County Forest Preserve District Board Members:

As you know, Hampton, Lenzini and Renwick, Inc. (HLR) was contracted by agreement dated November 14, 2018 to provide Phase III Construction Services (see attached). This agreement was for pre-construction, construction services and post-construction. The construction services were to provide part-time resident engineering for an estimate of 24 hours per week for 4.5 weeks. Our goal was to be on-site for major construction activities throughout the duration of the project. This can be challenging when we are only contracted on a part-time basis, so we work with the contractor to discuss the operations taking place and develop our schedule to observe major activities.

On August 25<sup>th</sup>, the first day of construction operations, our technician, Lenard Lynn was on-site in the morning. He spoke with the contractor and it was determined that they would be removing timber deck planking all day. That is a monotonous, straight-forward task that would not typically require observation, so the decision was made to not use up our limited hours observing this task. We were to return the following day to observe the crane and barges being set in place for the structure removal.

During the night on August 25<sup>th</sup>, we were informed by Dave Guritz that the superstructure was down. We were never notified by the contractor that there were any instability issues or that they planned to modify the approved demolition plan.

After observing the debris in the water from the demolition, we immediately sent our survey crews with drone technology to the site to collect data to try and determine how much debris was in the water. We manually probed searching for debris for the contractor to remove. We worked with the contractor to hire a third party that could provide sonar data to give an even more accurate depiction of the debris. We felt that this was the right action to determine and minimize any damage to the environment and we did not invoice this time to the Forest Preserve District.

HLR has a long-standing good relationship with Kendall County and the Forest Preserve District. We have worked on many projects together and value our relationship very much. We are disheartened to hear the negative comments from board members about our service to the county. Our first priority is your satisfaction and our continued relationship; therefore, we are offering to write off our time and void the invoice dated October 12,2020. However, we do ask that you separate the contractor's actions from those of HLR and consider our professional actions on their own merit.



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## **Executive Summary**

#### Background

The Public Entity Professionals of Alliant Insurance Services, Inc. (Alliant) would like to thank you for the opportunity to present the December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020 to December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 insurance renewal proposal to the Kendall County Forest Preserve District (District). As one of the largest public entity insurance brokers in the state of Illinois, we utilize our significant leverage with the insurance marketplace to create the most comprehensive coverage programs at the most competitive pricing for our clients.

Last year, the District made a significant change to the District's insurance program coverage. The District had determined that it desired to lower its deductible/retention levels across all lines. Alliant conducted a competitive solicitation to review insurance programs options from IPARKS and the Illinois Public Risk (IPRF); and the District's existing insurance carrier, the Illinois Counties Risk Management Trust (ICRMT). The review resulted in the approval to remain with the ICRMT with deductible/retention amounts more aligned with the District's appetite for risk.

ICRMT is an intergovernmental risk pool for local governments operating in the state of Illinois. With over 380 member entities, ICRMT insures over 50% of the counties in Illinois and has been the County's and District's insurance provider from decades. The program provides property, casualty and workers' compensation insurance, and is administered by the Illinois Program Managers Group (IPMG), located in St. Charles, Illinois.

#### Renewal Summary

The challenging insurance market conditions that began in 2019 worsened through the first half of 2020 and have remained very difficult through the remainder of the year. The impact of catastrophic U.S. property losses (wildfires, hurricanes, floods, tornados), the COVID-19 pandemic, civil unrest and distrust of law enforcement will likely have a lasting impact on the insurance marketplace for public entities (including forest preserve districts) with regard to the availability of carriers and upward premium pricing.

However--- despite the unfavorable insurance market conditions mentioned, Alliant worked closely with the District's incumbent insurance carrier, the Illinois Counties Risk Management Trust (ICRMT), to convey the needs of our ICRMT clients and the negative financial and operational impact that these challenging times are having on public entities, like Kendall County Forest Preserve District. Our open communication channels with ICRMT and market leverage resulted in Alliant receiving early notice that premium relief was ahead. As such, ICRMT committed significant premium relief in the form of a premium credit to ICRMT members. The District is receiving a \$1,385 COVID premium credit.

As one of the largest intermediaries with ICRMT, we were successful in obtaining competitive pricing resulting in a minimal 4.75% increase (\$2,631) in total

premium cost with ICRMT in comparison to the 12/1/2019 to 12/1/2020 policy term.

Other factors impacting the renewal, most notably, are the following.

- Property Exposure- We were successful in clarifying multiple District property values to lower the total value of the District's property schedule.
- Workers' Compensation- Significant increase in reported payroll of \$245,895 (53%) in comparison to the renewal payroll figure from 12/1/2019 to 12/1/2020. The origin of the discrepancy in reported payroll is not known, but such a large gap had the potential to significantly increase premium. We were successful in negotiating down to a nominal increase.
- Workers' Compensation- The District's experience modification rate remains low at the same rate of .84.

Thank you so much for the opportunity to present the 12/1/2020 to 12/1/2021 insurance renewal. We at Alliant Insurance Services, Inc. are pleased with the results in a challenging insurance marketplace.

Established by law in every state, Guaranty Funds are maintained by the state's insurance commissioner to protect policyholders in the event that an insurer becomes insolvent or is unable to meet its financial obligations. If your insurance carrier is identified as 'Non-Admitted', your policy is not protected by your state's Guaranty Fund.

# Other Disclosures/Disclaimers (continued)

## Claims Reporting

Your policy will come with specific claim reporting requirements. Please make sure you understand these obligations. Contact your Alliant Service Team with any questions.

## Claims Made Policy

(Applicable to any coverage that is identified as claims made)

This claims-made policy contains a requirement stating that this policy applies only to any claim first made against the Insured and reported to the insurer during the policy period or applicable extended reporting period. Claims must be submitted to the insurer during the policy period, or applicable extended reporting period, as required pursuant to the Claims/Loss Notification Clause within the policy in order for coverage to apply. Late reporting or failure to report pursuant to the policy's requirements could result in a disclaimer of coverage by the insurer.

Any Employment Practices Liability (EPL) or Directors & Officers (D&O) with EPL coverage must give notice to the insurer of any charges / complaints brought by any state / federal agency (i.e. EEOC and similar proceedings) involving an employee. To preserve your rights under the policy, it is important that timely notice be given to the insurer, whether or not a right to sue letter has been issued.

## Changes and Developments

It is important that we be advised of any changes in your operations, which may have a bearing on the validity and/or adequacy of your insurance. The types of changes that concern us include, but are not limited to, those listed below:

- Changes in any operations such as expansion to another state, new products, or new applications of existing products.
- Travel to any state not previously disclosed.
- Permanent operations outside the United States, Canada or Puerto Rico.
- Mergers and/or acquisition of new companies and any change in business ownership, including percentages.
- Any newly assumed contractual liability, granting of indemnities or hold harmless agreements.
- Any changes in existing premises including vacancy, whether temporary or permanent, alterations, demolition, etc. Also, any new premises either purchased, constructed or occupied
- Circumstances which may require an increased liability insurance limit.
- Any changes in fire or theft protection such as the installation of or disconnection of sprinkler systems, burglar alarms, etc. This includes any alterations to the system.
- Immediate notification of any changes to a scheduled of equipment, property, vehicles, electronic data processing, etc.
- Property of yours that is in transit, unless previously discussed and/or currently insured.

# Other Disclosures/Disclaimers (continued)

## Certificates / Evidence of Insurance

A Certificate or Évidence is issued as a matter of information only and confers no rights upon the certificate holder. The certificate does not affirmatively or negatively amend, extend or alter the coverage afforded by a policy, nor does it constitute a contract between the issuing insurer(s), authorized representative, producer or recipient.

You may have signed contracts, leases or other agreements requiring you to provide this evidence. In those agreements, you may assume obligations and/or liability for others (Indemnification, Hold Harmless) and some of the obligations that are not covered by insurance. We recommend that you and your legal counsel review these documents.

In addition to providing a Certificate or Evidence of Insurance, you may be required to name your landlord, client or customer on your policy as a loss payee on property insurance or as an additional insured on liability insurance. This is only possible with permission of the insurance company, added by endorsement and, in some cases, an additional premium.

By naming the certificate holder as additional insured, there are consequences to your risks and insurance policy including:

- Your policy limits are now shared with other entities; their claims involvement may reduce or exhaust your aggregate limit.
- Your policy may provide higher limits than required by contract; your full limits can be exposed to the additional insured.
- There may be conflicts in defense when your insurer has to defend both you and the additional insured.
- An additional insured endorsement will most likely not provide notification of cancellation. Some insurance companies use a "blanket" additional insured endorsement that provides coverage automatically when it is required in a written contract. Most insurance companies do not want to be notified of all additional insureds when there is a blanket endorsement on the policy. If a notice of cancellation is required for the additional insured party, you must notify us immediately and we will request an endorsement from your insurance company. There may be an additional premium for adding a notice of cancellation endorsement for an additional insured.
