


Overview of Priority Trail System; Habitat Corridor and Kendall County Forest Preserve District Soil and Water Conservation Projects Planning and Advisory Committee



### **Land Acquisition Worksheet**

Decisions made regarding land acquisition are the responsibility of the Board of Commissioners of the Kendall County Forest Preserve District. This worksheet is meant to assist the board, along with staff recommendations and resident input, in the land acquisition process. Other factors including, but not limited to: price, threats to the property, needs of the District, and grant requirements will also be considered by the Commissioners when making land acquisition decisions.

This worksheet is numerically based, with a high score indicating a property with high value as preserved open space. For each quality that a parcel possesses, it receives the corresponding score. The total score can then be compared with scores of other parcels in order to evaluate the properties as potential forest preserves.







Little Rock Creek Forest Preserve Phase I Public Access Plan

### Pickerill-Pigott Forest Preserve Master Plan Phase I







Master Plan - Phase I Pickerill-Pigott Forest Preserve Kendall County Forest Preserve District



### Kendall County Forest Preserve District Planning and Advisory Committee

<u>Purpose</u>: The Kendall County Forest Preserve District Planning and Advisory Committee is charged with completing a high-level review of District mission-based activities, challenges, directions, and funding support needs. The goal of the Planning and Advisory Committee is to generate recommendations to the District's Board of Commissioners.

### Committee Service Pre-Assignments:

- 1. Review the KCFPD 2014-2019 Master Plan
- 2. Review the IDNR Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan 2014-2019
- 3. Review The Conservation Foundation 2019 Regional Conservation Message Study
- 4. Review the KC-GIS Website: Preserve Locations and Amenities
- 5. Review the Oak Ecosystem Recovery Project / Plan
- 6. Review the Chicago Wilderness Green Vision / Protect Kendall Now / iView (Prairie State Conservation Coalition)
- 7. Review of the CMAP NE IL Regional Greenways and Trails Plan

### Key Questions for the Planning and Advisory Committee:

- Land Conservation Program: How aggressively should the District pursue the purchase of additional forest preserve lands? How many acres should be acquired in the next 5/10/25 years?
- 2. <u>Natural Area Management</u>: How aggressively should the District pursue natural area restoration projects? How aggressively should the District pursue cropland conversion projects? How many acres should be under management in the next 5/10/25 years? What other natural area management priorities and/or research goals should be considered as part of the District's long-range planning? What priorities should be addressed?
- 3. <u>Trails and Greenway Corridors</u>: How aggressively should the District pursue greenway connectivity and linear trail corridor development? Where should the District focus trail corridor development efforts?
- 4. <u>Recreational Opportunities and Facilities</u>: What types of recreational opportunities should be offered/planned in the next 5-10 years? What types of facilities/amenities should be developed to support the recreational interests of Kendall County residents?
- 5. <u>Nature Education Programming Gap Analysis</u>: What types of programs and services should the District consider developing over the next 5-10 years, considering both active and passive educational focus and opportunities?

6. What, if any, <u>multi-purpose event facilities</u> are needed? Will the District's current facilities and near-term opportunities suffice, or are there future developments that should be considered?

The mission of the Kendall County Forest Preserve District is to acquire, preserve and manage natural areas and open spaces, provide environmental education, and offer recreational opportunities for Kendall County Residents.

Master Plan Goals (abbreviated):

- 1. Acquire and hold lands and properties. Preserve the flora, fauna, and scenic beauties for future generations.
- 2. Utilize forest preserves to provide educational opportunities focusing on the natural history of Kendall County.
- 3. Provide and maintain passive and active recreational opportunities and facilities compatible with the District's natural areas.
- 4. Provide and maintain multi-purpose event facilities.
- 5. Implement resource management to maintain and enhance natural area diversity.
- 6. Enhance practices and policies that promote fiscal responsibility and organizational proficiency.
- 7. Enhance use of media outlets to connect with County residents.
- 8. Partner with governmental agencies, conservation organizations, and private landowners to preserve nature, create greenway corridors and develop linear trails.
