

RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING KENDALL COUNTY COVID-19 VOLUNTEERS

WHEREAS, to date, 13,977 cases of COVID-19 have been reported in Kendall County and 100 deaths reported as attributable to complications caused by COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Kendall County was a leader in the State of Illinois in the organization of vaccination clinics; and

WHEREAS, on January 12, 2021, Kendall County opened a mobile vaccination clinic in a facility donated by the United City of Yorkville for use in administering vaccines at 651 Prairie Pointe Drive, Yorkville, IL; and

WHEREAS, the Kendall County Health Department's mobile vaccination clinic was open 4 days a week with varied hours from 9:00am to 7:00pm, and administered a daily average of 700 doses, with the highest daily vaccination of 1,400 doses administered on April 21, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Kendall County Health Department's mantra of getting "shots in arms" left Kendall County as a leader in the State of Illinois with ZERO wasted vaccines in the first five months; and

WHEREAS, Kendall County was also a leader in the State of Illinois by hosting mass vaccination clinics at Yorkville High School where School District 115 administration donated the use of their gym as a mass vaccination clinic, and School District 308 administration donated Oswego East High School and the use of their gym as a mass vaccination clinic; and

WHEREAS, the vaccination clinics were organized and led by the Kendall County Board of Health and Health Department staff; and Kendall County Board members and county staff, elected officials, municipalities, the business community and hundreds of nurses, doctors, law enforcement officers, community leaders and civilian volunteers assisted in registration of citizens and the administration of the vaccine; and

WHEREAS, over 132,241 vaccines overseen by the Kendall County Health Department have been administered by over 400 volunteers from all corners of Kendall County; and

WHEREAS, the residents of Kendall County stepped up in unprecedented ways to care for their neighbors and fellow residents; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE KENDALL COUNTY BOARD does hereby recognize everyone who volunteered to serve the citizens of Kendall County, Illinois in a time of uncertainty, crisis, and pandemic.
