WHEREAS, subject to the overall administrative authority of the Illinois Supreme Court set forth in Supreme Court Rule 21, and pursuant to the specific authority granted by Local Rule 1(B), the court is empowered to enter orders necessary to regulate the business of the courts;

WHEREAS, Richard B. Henry has sought judicial relief in various motions brought in this circuit court, but on occasion those efforts have been unsuccessful due to his inability to follow and/or comply with the various requirements pertaining to civil matters as set forth in the Illinois Code of Civil Procedure, Illinois Supreme Court Rules, and the Local Rules of the 23rd Circuit Court.

WHEREAS, Richard B. Henry's actions have compelled his opposing party(s) to appear unnecessarily in court, to incur needless delay in bringing ongoing litigation to a timely conclusion, and on occasion his conduct toward court staff has been hostile and combative;

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, that prior to sending notice of hearing to any opposing party, Richard B. Henry shall first be required to file a motion in the trial court seeking leave to file a notice of hearing to any opposing party. The judge presiding over the case shall

determine whether there is sufficient merit within the underlying motion to compel the opposing party to appear and defend the same.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, the Circuit Clerk is directed to continue to accept any proposed pleadings filed by Richard B. Henry, provided such filings are compliant with the Circuit Clerk's rejection standards applicable to all other litigants, however, the circuit clerk shall automatically reject any proposed notice of hearing filed by Richard B. Henry, unless the trial court has previously entered an order setting the matter for a future hearing date. This order is applicable solely to civil cases brought within the 23rd Judicial Circuit.
