The Historic Preservation Commission began with the passage of the Historic Preservation Ordinance in 2006.

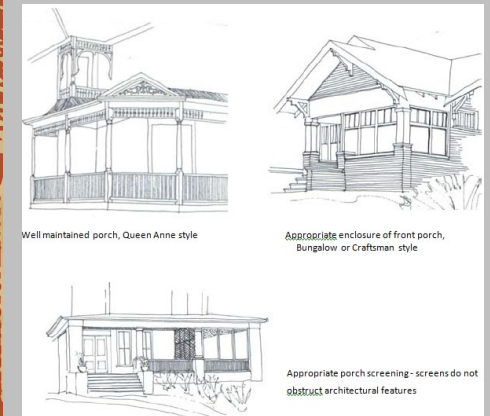
The HPC is comprised of five citizen appointees who have a strong interest or knowledge in fields closely related to historic preservation.

of an important person, was the place of an important event, or for some other reason significant to Kendall County. A landmark is a property recommended by the Historic Preservation Commission and officially designated by the County Board.
