ORDINANCE NO. 05-43

ORDINANCE IMPOSING WEEKEND PERIODIC IMPRISONMENT FEE

WHEREAS, pursuant to Illinois Law, 730 ILCS 5/5-7-6, the Kendall County Board with the concurrence of the Chief Judge of the Sixteenth Judicial Circuit, is authorized to set room and board rates for periodic imprisonment for weekend only inmates who are gainfully employed; and

WHEREAS, Kendall County recognizes the advantages of permitting eligible inmates to remain gainfully employed in order to permit them to support their dependants and maintain their employment upon release from custody; and

WHEREAS, Kendall County currently operates a periodic imprisonment for weekend incarceration program for inmates that are gainfully employed and does not currently charge inmates who participate in such a program; and

WHEREAS, the operation of such program causes Kendall County to incur greater costs than those normally associated with incarceration of an inmate not engaged in a periodic imprisonment for weekend incarceration program; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that those inmates benefiting from a periodic imprisonment for weekend incarceration program should incur some of the increased costs associated with such a program; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Judge or his designee (Presiding Judge of Kendall County) and the Sheriff of Kendall County agree that the fee should be set in the amount of \$20.00 per forty-eight hours of incarceration (\$10.00 per day) which falls within the parameters set forth in 730 ILCS 5/5-7-6; and

WHEREAS, all funds collected according to the provisions of 730 ILCS 5/5-7-6 are to be remitted to the Kendall County Treasurer for deposit into the General Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Kendall County Board, in cooperation with the Chief Judge or his designee (Presiding Judge of Kendall County) and Sheriff, hereby sets the fee for the periodic imprisonment for weekend incarceration at \$20.00 per forty-eight hours of incarceration (\$10.00 per day).

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall take effect upon the implementation of a General Order by the Chief Judge of the Sixteenth Judicial Circuit or his designee (Presiding Judge of Kendall County).
